Monthly Meeting Of Summerside Town Council

In the absence of Mayor Henry W. Wedge, Acting Mayor T. D. Morrison presided at last night's meeting of the Summerside Town Council. All the councillors were present.

Town bills paid, amounting to \$18,947.81, were approved and town unpaid bills amounting to \$4,741.10 were ordered paid.

Electric light paid bills amounting to \$104.83 were approved and electric light unpaid bills amounting to \$13,140.49 were ordered paid.

The Town Clerk announced that as at the end of the month of June taxes amounting to \$81,059.00 had been collected. This, he pointed out, represented fifty per cent of the town taxes payable.

The report of the Police Department as presented by Councillor Steele recommended that Notre Dame Street be made a through street from Central West to the town limits. On motion of Councillor Schurman this recommendation was passed as a resolution and the town by laws will be so amended.

Brief reports from the various councillors were received and tabled. Councillor Driscoll stated that all the engines at the electric light plant had been completely overhauled now and that everything at the plant was in tip top shape.

Councillor Schurman reported that the work of patching the streets in Summerside was now pretty well completed.

Councillor Sheen drew the attention of the meeting to the large number of high hedges at many street intersections in Summerside and said that these constituted a menace to driving. This matter was referred to the attention of Councillor Steele of the Police Department who said that he would take the matter up with the police and that necessary steps would be taken to remedy this.

Drowned In B. C.

A recent article in the "Golden Star," newspaper of Golden, B. C., tells of the death by drowning of nine-year-old Arthur Langlands.

The mother of the deceased is a former Islander, daughter of Mrs. Arthur C. Gardiner and the late Arthur C. Gardiner of Preetown. Following is the article as it appeared:

"The Kicking Horse River claimed the life of Arthur Langlands, nine-year-old son of Mr. and Mrs. J. A. Langlands, on Monday afternoon, June 30th, when he fell into the water and was carried away by the swift current.

"Arthur and a playmate, Gary Sorley, were playing on the river bank near the railway bridge about 4 p. m., when the unfortunate lad lost his footing and fell into the fast running stream. His young companion ran for help, but before assistance could arrive the current had carried the lad away.

"The river is fairly high and muddy, and despite a search by the boy's father, the police and a number of volunteers, the body had not been recovered at the time of going to press.

"Arthur is survived by his parents and two younger sisters."
