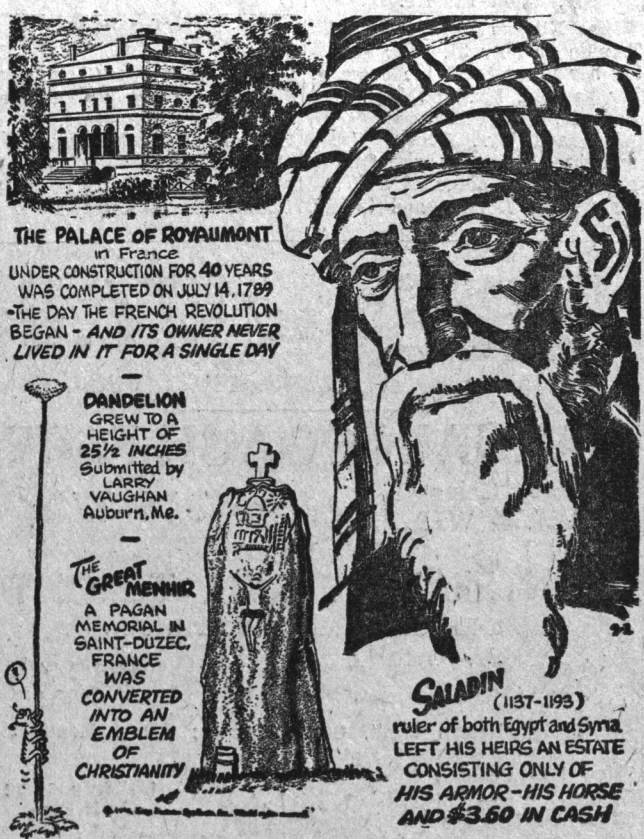

The bidding:
South West North East
1♥ 4♣ 4♥ Dble

Opening lead—king of clubs. The preemptive bid is a confession of defensive weakness. The chief purpose of the bid is to try to use up a lot of bidding space so that the opponents will have as little room as possible for the exchange of information. Thus, West's four club bid is an example of a sound tactical measure. With 7 sure winners and 100 honors to protect himself from more than a 400-point penalty in case of a business double, and almost no defensive values if the opponents play the hand, the preemptive bid has much to recommend it. East's double of four hearts can scarcely be approved. There

was no real basis for him to expect to take four tricks, and he should have passed. The club lead was taken in dummy and the nine of hearts was led and finessed when East played small. Both West's preemptive bid and East's double indicated the double finesse was the best way to deal with the trump situation. Another heart lead brought the jack from East and the king from South. After ruffing a club in dummy declarer led another heart and picked up both of East trumps. It was obvious that East had to have the king of diamonds and the king of spades for his double. So declarer led a low diamond to the ace and another diamond back toward his queen. East hopped up with the king, but it would not have mattered if he had played the ten. It was the first trick for the defense. He returned the jack of diamonds, which South won with the queen. Declarer then put East back in the lead by exiting with a diamond. By now ten tricks had been played and the defense had taken only two of them. East was forced to return a spade, having only spades left. When he led a low one, South ducked and dummy's queen became trick number nine for the declarer. The ace of spades provided the tenth trick of a well-played hand.

New, Small Kit Big Value To Prospectors For Copper

VANCOUVER (CP) — A prospecting kit no bigger than a lunch bucket which may guide Canadian mining companies to new deposits of copper has been developed by two University of British Columbia geologists. The laboratory and field work which contributed to the successful development of the technique was made possible by support of Keneco Explorations (Canada) Ltd., the Geological Survey of Canada, the Defence Research Board and Consolidated Mining and Smelting Co. The technique will be officially recognized in November when a paper describing it is published in the official journal of the American Institute of Mining, Metallurgical and Petroleum Engineers.

Gov't Silent On Unemployment Insurance Fund

OTTAWA (CP) — The government was non-committal Friday when asked in the Commons what it intends to do about placing the unemployment insurance fund on a sound basis. Speaker Roland Michener ruled the question by H. J. Robichaud (L.-Gloucester) was not urgent and could not be dealt with on the spur of the moment during the question period. Opposition leader Pearson asked what could be more urgent than the soundness of the fund with winter unemployment approaching. Mr. Michener said the question involved government policy. Mr. Robichaud asked whether the government would amend the Unemployment Insurance Act to take care of the "present" situation. Finance Minister Fleming said if any decision were taken it would be communicated to the Commons. The unemployment insurance committee said Thursday in a report tabled in the Commons that the unemployment insurance fund in recent months has reduced its reserves below a safe level. There was a record drain of \$134,200,124 on the fund during the fiscal year last March 31.
