### Council Meeting

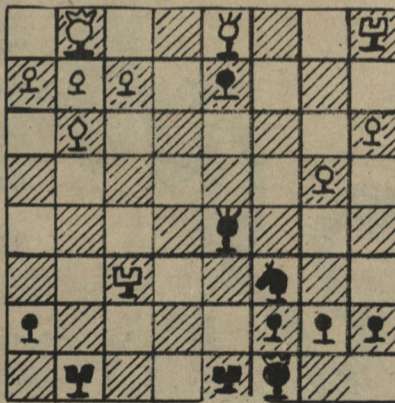
The next meeting of the Student Council will be held Sunday September the 28th in the Barn at 6:00 pm. Please note the change in time.

This position eminently illustrates how the potential the passed pawn possesses exerts a crippling influence on the white position. White could have captured the Black knight at move two, hoping to entice Black into taking the rook at rook 1, in which case White wins. i.e. RXPch. If Black declines and takes the rook at bishop 6, White faces extinction.
