The bidding:  
South West North East

Opening lead—nine of spades.

There is one peculiar position sometimes reached in the play of the dummy where declarer has to make a crucial guess, and the nature of the situation is such that he can afford the luxury of a wrong guess, knowing it will come out right even if he is wrong.

This anomalous position was artfully contrived by South in today's hand. West opened a spade and declarer allowed the jack to win the trick.

Having no entry card, East abandoned spades and shifted to the ten of diamonds. South sized up the situation correctly and took the diamond return with the ace. Had he finessed the queen of diamonds, or ducked the ten,

South would have gone down three.

A club to the queen held the trick and a club back went to the ace. West now avoided a heart return, which would have handed declarer his ninth trick on a silver platter. He chose, instead, the neutral return of a club.

South could now count eight sure tricks—a spade, three hearts, a diamond, and three clubs. The question was whether he would be able to make a ninth by bringing home an extra heart trick. This could happen if the hearts broke 3-3, or if the jack of hearts fell as the A-K-Q were cashed.

But declarer also saw there was an additional chance to make nine tricks, one which did not depend on luck or guessing the actual heart situation.

After taking his club tricks, South cashed the ace of spades, West discarding a diamond. Next the A-K of hearts were cashed, followed by a heart from dummy. East played low and South finessed the ten without a tremor. When it won, South had nine tricks.

Good guess, you say? No. South had a sure thing. If the finesse had lost, West, who could have only diamonds left, would have been compelled to lead one to South's queen for trick number nine.

It's just like we said. This was a situation where the finesse was bound to make the contract, win or lose.

**Montreal Conference Holds Hopes For British M.P.'s.**

LONDON—Many British members of Parliament are greatly concerned that the forth-coming Commonwealth Trade and Economic Conference in Montreal should be a success and produce specific results. Their concern is expressed in a motion, signed by over 100 M.P.'s and placed on the order paper of the House of Commons. The motion is sponsored by 16 Conservative members of the Commons and one member of the House of Lords, who have formed what is known as the Expanding Commonwealth Committee.

The motion placed on the order paper reads as follows:

**MONTREAL CONFERENCE**  
That this House, concerned that the Commonwealth share of world trade has declined in recent years, pledges its full support to Her Majesty's Government in all measures they take to expand the trade and influence of the Commonwealth, and welcoming the Diefenbaker offer of a switch of trade, to raise the living standard in the Commonwealth with the help of Commonwealth agricultural surpluses, and to improve the machinery for Commonwealth investment and consultation, and calls on Her Majesty's Government to give an inspiring lead at the Montreal Conference in September.

Today we attended a press conference at the House of Commons called by this Expanding Commonwealth Group, at which a memorandum setting forth its ideas on Commonwealth matters was presented. In the chair was the Hon. Patrick Hamilton, M.P., Master of Lauderdale, with him were other members of the group and its expert advisors.

**LONG DECLINE**  
The Memorandum, which has been presented to the British Government and to the Prime Ministers of all Commonwealth countries, covers a great deal of ground. It stresses the fact that since 1933, there has been a significant and fairly continuous decline, both in inter-Commonwealth trade and in the Commonwealth share of world trade.

In an effort to remedy this, the memorandum lays great stress on the possibilities of switching trade from Foreign Countries to Commonwealth countries, and makes specific reference to what it terms "Mr. Diefenbaker's proposed 15 per cent switch of trade." If this 15 per cent switch were achieved, it says, Britain would return to its percentage position of 1933 in the Canadian import market. The group expresses confidence that this can be achieved. It makes recommendations that Britain and other members of the Commonwealth make plans for switching trade from Foreign sources.

In an appendix it lists some 300 pounds of imports now coming to Britain from foreign sources which could be switched to Commonwealth countries. It recommends that Canada, for instance, could be a source of supply for greater quantities of cheese, wheat, barley, maize, apples, wood, copper, aluminium, 'east' and zinc now coming to Britain from Foreign countries. The value of these items, imported from Foreign countries, is about 111 million pounds, or \$350 million.

**POLITICAL**  
Summing up the conference, Hon. Mr. Maitland said, "The Montreal Conference will be essentially political, with subject matter of an economic nature. The United Kingdom has a direct interest in Commonwealth prosperity. Investigations reveal a disturbing trend that Commonwealth trade has not increased at the same rate as world trade. Our Manifesto suggests that something should be done about it while there is yet time. If the Montreal Conference is not a success, it may be our last chance to make the full impact of the Commonwealth felt on world affairs."
