

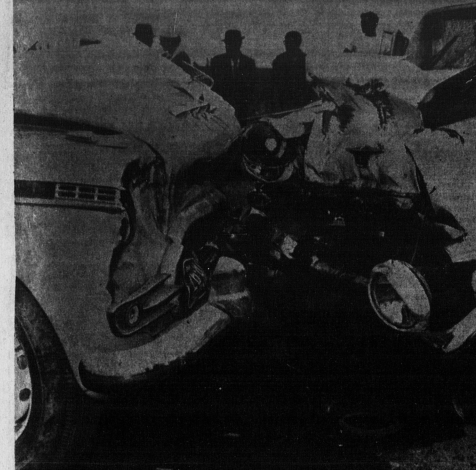

Five Injured In Accident At Mt. Mellick On Sunday

Four adults and a child received injuries in a head-on collision between two English model cars at Mt. Mellick on the Trans Canada Highway at about 10.30 o'clock Sunday morning.

In the Prince Edward Island Hospital, and reported to be suffering serious injuries, are Rev. and Mrs. Gordon MacBeth, residents of Nova Scotia. Mr. MacBeth, a native of Nova Scotia, is 61 years old. He had a charge at Clyde River, Port La Jolie on Nova Scotia's South Shore. He plans to take post-operative work this fall in Scotland. Mr. MacBeth is reported to be suffering severe skull lacerations and chest injuries. His wife sustained a fractured left shoulder and lacerations of the face and legs.

Beef Price Increase Expected

An increase is reported in the prices that may be expected this week for the three top grades of beef steers, it was announced by J.L. Dewar, secretary of a special committee of the Beef Producers' association.

The prices which show a real wide basis, hot-drum weight, are \$16.50 per-100 pounds for the top grade, up 72 cents from last week; \$15.75 for Blues, up 2 cents and \$14.75 for the two lower grades, up 10 cents from last week.

Trust Britain Plea Expected From Mac

LONDON (Reuters) — Prime Minister Macmillan is expected to make a "trust Britain" appeal to uneasy Commonwealth leaders when they turn to the question of British entry into the European Common Market at the prime minister's conference opening today.

The British prime minister is known to be confident he can persuade the Commonwealth leaders that a British move into Europe will in the long run be of over-all advantage to the Commonwealth countries and their 750,000,000 people.

Why Girl Diets, Named Miss America

ATLANTIC CITY, N.J., (AP) — Talk show host and dietitian Mary Kay Morgan says that a chubby little girl in Sandusky, Ohio, Jackie dreamed of being Miss America. Today she is a slender beauty.

Jackie met reporters and photographers at her first press conference since being crowned Miss America of 1963 a few months after midnight.

"I was always chubby until I was about 16 years old," she says. "I guess it's all right to say it. I weighed 120 pounds."

"When I was a sophomore in high school," continued the 20-year-old beauty, "I decided it was about time to lose some weight. We ate at the school cafeteria, so I saved money by having my lunch in my room. I also watched my evening meals and had very early breakfasts."

Now she has a \$225,000 trust fund, but has to be careful what she eats. She stands at 5'11 inches. Her hair is long.

Jackie's father, Miss America's father, has had her friends call it on if when she lets it evolve. Her personal trainer, Don Knapp of Sandusky, said her stress are 50 inches long.

Diefenbaker Pleased After Talks With Mac

LONDON (CP) — Prime Minister Diefenbaker, reported to be heartened by some last-minute developments on the eve of the Commonwealth conference, lunched Sunday with Prime Minister Macmillan.

The two leaders emerged from Macmillan's Admiralty House residence checking over a private joke, and Diefenbaker later described their talks as "very fine."

In their two-hour meeting they discussed the key issue coming before the Commonwealth conference — Britain's bid to enter the European Economic Community.

Russian Camp Is Reported Near Havana

HAVANA (Reuters) — There is little evidence here of a major Soviet buildup — but outside Havana I saw several hundred Russians during an automobile tour Saturday.

The Russians are living in a big camp being built at a former reformatory about 10 miles south of here near El Cano.

After driving along dirt roads to the camp, which spreads over many acres, I saw covered trucks, prefabricated buildings and camouflaged tents.

Soviet Spy Dr. Soblen Takes Turn For Worse

LONDON (AP) — Convulsions and the possibility of brain damage added new complications Sunday to a medical team's battle to bring runaway U.S. spy Robert A. Soblen back to consciousness.

After a turn for the better Saturday, Dr. Soblen's condition worsened and he became susceptible to convulsions. The 50-year-old New York psychiatrist has been in a constant coma for some days since he took an overdose of barbiturates in an ambulance taking him to the U.S. and a life prison term for war-time spying for the Russians.

Red China Claims U.S. Spy Program De Gaulle Ends Tour Of Germany

TAIPEI (AP) — Communist China claimed it shot down a Nationalist Chinese U-2 plane over East China and charged that the flight by the American-made plane was part of a U.S. spy program directed from Japan.

The Nationalist regime acknowledged that one of its U-2s was missing over the Chinese mainland on a "routine" reconnaissance mission Sunday. The Nationalist government said it had bought two of the high-altitude planes in the United States and had been operating them for nearly two years.

Two Killed In Toronto Street Crash

TORONTO (CP) — Two men were killed and a woman seriously injured early Saturday when a stolen moving van crashed over a car and crashed head-on into a convertible in the north-east section of Metro.

Victor James Chisanson, 22, driver of the truck, Karl Ernest Chisanson, 29, a passenger in the convertible, were dead on arrival at Scarborough General Hospital. Chisanson was described by police as being from the Maritimes. Chisanson was a Toronto resident.
