#### CHARCOAL FIRE

For cooking, I prefer a coal or even charcoal fire in a grate with a movable grill. And you will need asbestos mitts and long-handled tongs, too. Then it is easy to enjoy roasted chestnuts and frankfurters, but a complete dinner.

Toasted Cheese Rolls. Slice and butter soft rolls. Insert in each a thin slice of fill pickle and a narrow strip of sharp American cheese as long as the roll.

Impale on a broasting fork and toast until the cheese melts. Or broil on a grill if there's no fireplace.

Prepared dinner: Muffled potato, tossed salad bowl, apple pie, cheese, coffee, tea, milk.

All measurements are level; recipes proportioned to serve 4 to 6.

Shashlik. Cut 2 lbs. lean lamb in 1-in. cubes. Remove tough membranes. Place the lamb in a small casserole. Add 1 fine-shredded onion, 2 sliced peeled onions and 1 tsp. lemon juice, fresh or frozen.

Scald 1 c. each unseasoned grape juice and water with 2 bay leaves and 2 whole cloves. Pour over the lamb. Cover; refrigerate at 24 hrs.

To cook: Drain. Stick on long skewers. Broil from Paris to New York. Tomorrow's dinner—Pineapple pie, baked mackerel, lemon wedge, scalloped potatoes, diced turnips, snow pudding with custard sauce, coffee, tea, milk.

Mulleo tomato juice from the chief. Heat 3 c. tomato juice with 1 whole clove, 1 tsp. Worcestershire and 1/2 tsp. curry powder dissolved in 1/2 cup water. Strain and serve very hot in cups. Garnish with half lemon slices.

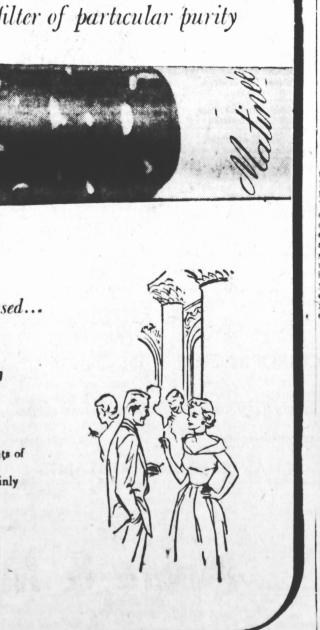
