NEW YORK

NEW YORK (AP) - Trading became a little livelier Tuesday as the stock market posted its first gain in five sessions.
To analysts it looked like another routine move in the "base building" process they believe the market has been engaged in after the spring decline ended and the market recovered part-way.
A summer rally has been predicted on many sides, based on a continuing body of statistics showing the years and the fact that prices now are at a relatively low level on average.
The Dow Jones industrial average rose 2.22 to 894.98.
Volume was 6,870,000 shares compared with 5,940,000 Monday.
Standard and Poor's 500-stock index rose 23 to 86.7.
AP AVERAGE DIPS
The Associated Press average of 60 stocks decline 2 to 321.2 with industrials up 1.4, rails off .8 and utilities off .6 to a new low for the year.
The well-known glamor stocks among color televisions, electronics, airlines, aerospace, office equipments and photographic issues were once more the leaders of the upturn.
Among Canadian issues, Canadian Pacific advanced 2, McIntyre Porcupine 1, Distillers Seagrams 3, Walker Gooderham 4, International Nickel 4, Hudson Bay Mining, Alcan and Dome Mines 5.
