## Helen Larter, Earl Smith Win Singles Titles At P.E.I. Tennis Tournament

Earl Smith of Summerside and Miss Helen Larter of the Charlottetown Club captured the Prince Edward Island men's singles and ladies singles tennis championships respectively at the Charlottetown Tennis Club courts in Provincial tournament play there yesterday.

Smith defeated runner-up Jim Palmer of the City Club in a grueling three-set battle yesterday afternoon by scores of 7-5, 6-2, 7-5, while Miss Larter downed former champion Miss Audrey DeBlols, also of the local Club, by scores of 5-7, 6-2, 6-3, in a well-played, keenly contested match yesterday morning.

Both contests came up with some excellent displays of tennis that were exciting features for a large gallery of tennis enthusiasts who turned out to witness the play, as did many other of the thirteen matches that were run off in weekend tournament competitions.

Tournament play in remaining doubles events will be continued this evening when some eight matches in men's and ladies doubles and mixed doubles will be held. The finals in these events are expected to wind up the Provincial Closed Tournament on Wednesday.

## Falcons Win Both Ends Of Twin Bill From C.&B.

Ment's Falcons yesterday afternoon took a double header from the Curran and Briggs team from Summerside at Memorial Field to move within a game and a half of the league leaders. In the first game which was a continuation of a tie game the locals scored the winning run in the last of the ninth on Lefty MacAleer's single to right field with MacKinnon scoring from second. The score being 6-5.

The final game of the double-header saw the Mentmen run amok over the construction crew winning going away 8-1. The newly erected scoreboard was in working order and many favourable comments were heard about it.

Roy "Buck" Whitlock, who trades a piece of hickory to a willow wisp as the seasons progress, was the outstanding player in the second game as he smashed out a home run and a pair of doubles in four times at bat for the winners. In his other time at bat for the second game he hit a long fly to left field that the fielder missed and Whitlock made his way around to third. He also handled seven chances in the infield without a miscue.

MacAleer also turned in a creditable performance in the second game as he hurled a four hit ball game while walking two and hitting another. He retired eight C & B batters on strikeouts. He was opposed in the second game by Alan Stewart who yielded to Finn after five innings of work. The winners combed the offerings of both hurlers for ten hits including another home run by Moe Goodwin. The four base blows came in successive times at bat by Whitlock and Goodwin in the fourth frame.

Wally Shepherd and Irv MacKinnon had two hits for the Falcons. Only extra base blow of MacAleer went to Paul Schurman who hit a double in the fifth.
