

Election Talk Is News To Him, N.B. Premier Claims

BATHURST, N.B. (CP)—The weekly newspaper Northern Light said Thursday that "veteran politicians" in New Brunswick predict Premier Hugh John F. Cameron will call a provincial election within the next six months. At Fredericton, the premier said he had no comment except "it's as much news to me as to anyone."

In the last provincial election, in June, 1956, Premier Fleming's Progressive Conservative government was re-elected with 37 seats against 15 Liberals and 17 supporters against 15 Liberals in the 52-seat legislature. Elections are usually held every four years but New Brunswick governments may, and sometimes have,

37 In PEI Get Certificates Of Citizenship

OTTAWA, (Special)—Certificates of Canadian citizenship were granted to 37 residents of Prince Edward Island during 1957, compared with 2 in 1956. This was disclosed Friday in the annual report of the citizenship and immigration department for 1957-58 released by Hon. Ellen Fairclough, minister. Across Canada, a total of 95,449 people received Canadian citizenship certificates, a 70 per cent increase over 1956 when only 55,404 persons were granted certificates.

Of the 37 in P.E.I., 26 live in rural areas and 11 in urban centres. In 21 of the 37 cases, the persons granted citizenship had emigrated to Canada and settled in P. E. I. during the period 1951-55.

A total of 134 immigrants went to P.E.I. in 1957 to make their homes. Of this total, 66 were of British origin, 23 from the U.S. and 12 were from the Netherlands. Eleven were Hungarian refugees.
