tract. A diamond is led and declarer wins and cashes A-K of hearts, discarding a diamond. He then leads the eight of spades and East must now put on his thinking bonnet if the contract is to be defeated.

It would be an astonishing discovery if a bridge player could be found who did not play his cards better seeing all 52 cards instead of only the 26 the law allows.

Nevertheless, there are limitless numbers of hands where each player can be reasonably expected to play as though all four hands were known to him.

Suppositions can be made about the two concealed hands by declarer and defender alike which will lead to the same result as though all the cards had appeared face up on the table.

Consider this hand where East is defending a four spade con-
