THE JUBILEE PROCESSION.

Official Programme Published in the Times.

Where Premier Laurier and the Canadian Troops Will Be.

LONDON, June 11.—The Times gives the official programme of the procession for June 22. An imposing array of regulars with bands and seven batteries of artillery will form the vanguard. Then will come Royal Aides-de-Camp, Field Marshalls and their equeries, foreign attaches and deputies, the Queen's Prussian Dragoons, Lord Mayor, thirty-six English and foreign Princes, Indian escort, Lord Wolseley, Commander-in-Chief, immediately preceding the Queen who will have the Duke of Cambridge on her right hand and the Prince of Wales and Duke of Connaught on her left. Then will follow the Gold Sticks-in-waiting, Masters of Horses and Masters of Buck-Hounds with their equeries and royal grooms. A large body of home and colonial troops will come next with the colonial troops forming the Queen's escort in separate colonial procession. It will be noticeable that the Canadian troops are followed immediately by Hon. Mr. Laurier the Canadian Premier who will be the first after advance guard of royal horse guards, while a portion of the Canadian troops will bring up the rear.

EXTRAORDINARY RUMORS,

Germany Said to Want the War Prolonged.

It is Said That Her Object is the Overthrow of the Greek Dynasty.

LONDON, June 11.—A correspondent of the Mail says: Extraordinary rumors are current as to the attitude of Germany. It is alleged that the German Government seeks the overthrow of the Greek dynasty, and to establish rigorous control of Greek finances in order to attain a double object. Germany wants a continuance of the war and to have the terms of peace finally dictated in Athens itself.

INTERCOLONIAL EXTENSION.

The Road to be Extended Into Montreal.

Equivalent of Seven Millions to be Added to the Public Debt.

OTTAWA, June 11.—In committee of supply on the railway estimates, Sir Charles Tupper asked for information in reference to the agreement for the extension of the Intercolonial to Montreal.

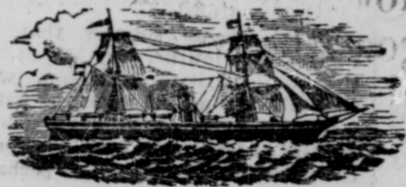
This motion brought on a lively discussion. Hon. Mr. Blair said this arrangement had been concluded so far as possible without parliamentary authority. The terms had been agreed upon with the Grand Trunk Railway and the Drummond Counties Railway to secure an extension of the Inter-colonial into Montreal not later than November next. The facts brought were that the equivalent of seven million dollars will be added to the Federal debt for a zigzag line 76 miles longer than the present route, via St. John. The scheme is a good thing for the Grand Trunk and some Montreal capitalists, who get clear of a white elephant road. The discussion will be resumed when Hon. Mr. Blair brings down the measure.

The Inter-Maritime Match.

HALIFAX, June 11.—The Inter-Maritime match at Bedford yesterday was won by Nova Scotia with a score of 705 points. New Brunswick came second with 698 points, and P. E. Island third with 651.
