Federal Attitude Re Ferry Service Is Condemned By West Prince Conservatives

Mr. Earle Ellis of West Cape was elected president of the West Prince Progressive-Conservative Association at a well attended annual meeting held in O'Leary yesterday afternoon. Mr. John F. Arsenault of Wellington R.R. was elected vice-president and Mr. Lloyd Matthews, O'Leary was re-elected to the position of secretary. These officers were elected by the executive following the regular meeting. The members of the executive are as follows: 1st district, C. F. Morrissey, Tignish; Alfred Gillis, Alberton; 2nd district, Earle Ellis, West Cape; Sidney Inman, Victoria West; 3rd district, John F. Arsenault, Wellington, R.R. The first named for each district are also members of the Provincial Executive. Other appointments to the Provincial Executive were Mrs. Austin MacDonald, Tignish, representing the Women's Association and Dr. L. G. Dewar, O'Leary, representing the Young Progressive-Conservative Association. The meeting was addressed by the new provincial leader, Mr. R. R. Bell, K.C., M.L.A., who dealt on the loss sustained by the Province as a result of the tie-up of the car ferries during the railway strike and pointed out that this was permitted by the Federal Government in spite of the fact that the Island was guaranteed continuous communication with the mainland, at the time of Confederation. Resolutions were passed expressing confidence in the Federal Leadership of the Hon. George Drew, expressing appreciation for the work and labor of the retired Provincial Leader, Dr. W. J. P. MacMillan and extending a welcome to the new leader, Mr. R. R. Bell.
