CARDIFF, Wales, June 25.—(CP)—Prime Minister Chamberlain told Germany in a speech here Saturday that co-operation between Great Britain and Germany "must remain constant until Germany is ready to drop her unjust suspicions of others."

LONDON, June 25.—(C.P.)—Great Britain plans to take retaliatory measures against Japan before the end of this week, informed quarters said today, unless the Japanese agree to negotiate the Tientsin dispute.

Faced by a growing demand for "strong action" the Cabinet was said to have decided to authorize such measures at its regular meeting Wednesday if the Japanese Government continues silent on numerous British representations.
