Hong Kong More Valuable To China As British Colony

HONG KONG (AP)—A question often asked by newcomers to this British crown colony is: "Will the Chinese Communists take Hong Kong?"
Most optimists here will reply: "No, at least not now or for some years to come."

Both the British who govern the island and resident foreigners readily concede that the Communists would have no trouble, militarily, in seizing Hong Kong from its small British garrison.
"They wouldn't have to do much more than make a few phone calls," is the usual, half-serious comment.

THE PEIPING-OWNED BANK OF China is the colony's biggest structure (although soon to be topped by an 18-storey British bank).
Nevertheless, there is little doubt that the dominant sentiment among Hong Kong's 2,500,000 Chinese is anti-Communist.

THREE NEWSPAPERS
The Chinese Communists publish three newspapers here, operate a government purchasing agency and a government travel agency as well as run several schools and numerous retail shops.
