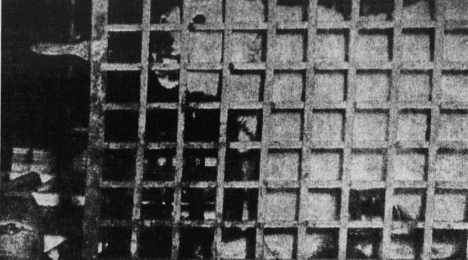
DOCTORS' STRIKE

The 70-per-cent appreciation in the Dow Jones industrial average since 1962, says one analyst, reflects the growth of earnings up 330 per cent, and of dividends (up 27 per cent) and the decline in the purchasing power of the dollar from 100 cents in 1942 to 50 cents today.

How has the recent rise come about? The stock crash in the spring of 1962 was the worst since 1929.

The collapse of the market is ascribed to a trough of 538 of 23. With the crisis over, stock prices climbed vigorously.

An upsurge of profits and dividend payments followed in 1963. The Federal Reserve bank and public hearings on the investigation of securities markets by the Securities and Exchange Commission.

Its stock prices crashed from \$33,000,000,000 in December, 1961, to \$299,000,000,000 in June, 1962. The level of \$299,000,000,000 is similar to the one after the Wall Street crash of 1929.
