

# No Escape For Farmers In Pension Contributions

OTTAWA (CP)—Most farmers have until the end of this year to make their first contributions for coverage under the Canada Pension Plan and there is no way to avoid the liability, government officials said here.

Officials of the national health and welfare department, which sponsors the Canada Pension Plan, and of the national revenue department, which does the accounting, said they have received no formal protest from a group of Alberta farmers about their liability for contributions. WANTED TO OPT OUT

Some 250 farmers in the Red Deer district are reported wanting to “opt out” of the pension plan. This, officials here say, is impossible. Coverage of the plan is compulsory for all and there is no machinery by which anyone can opt out.

Officials of both departments said that a person who refuses to contribute to the pension plan will be caught out at income tax time. He can be prosecuted for failure to contribute.

But whether or not prosecutions would actually be launched in the case of individual farmers is an open question. An official said, the federal government has not enough staff to go chasing farmers along every rural road in the country, hauling them into court to failure to pay.

**EMPLOYEES CONTRIBUTE**  
Under the pension plan, the revenue department gathers in 3.6 per cent of all incomes between \$600 and \$5,000 a year from all employed persons 18 and over. Employees contribute 1.8 per cent, employers the other 1.8 per cent.

Self-employed persons must pay the entire 3.6 per cent and they enter the plan when they earn \$800 or more a year.

The minimum and maximum limits of \$600 and \$5,000 for the employed means that persons earning less than the minimum will not make any contributions or receive any benefits, and persons earning more than the maximum will not make any contributions on income above \$5,000.

A self-employed person who is not a farmer and who estimates his income for the year is enough to bring the contribution to \$40 or more, must make his contribution quarterly, at the end of March, June, September and December. If the amount is less than \$40 he is to make his contribution next spring when filing his tax return for 1965.

But in the case of an individual farmer the pension plan contribution of 3.6 per cent does not fall due until Dec. 31 this year and April 30 next year.

**PAYS TWICE YEARLY**  
A farmer pays his income tax and now his pension plan contribution—twice a year. Two-thirds of the amount is due at the end of the calendar year when he is able to estimate his income for the year and the balance at income tax time the following April.

A farmer who employs help however is required by law to make regular payroll deductions of 1.8 per cent from the employee's cheques and contribute 1.8 per cent out of his own pocket. These payments are to be sent to the revenue department every month.

A revenue department spokesman said Alberta ranchers who regularly hire a number of workers are accustomed to monthly deductions for income taxes and find the additional deductions for Canada Pension Plan payments “little additional administrative burden.”

But he said there is difficulty getting small farmers to recognize the legal requirements for monthly deductions and contributions under the pension plan in cases where a farmer hires one man, either on a part-time basis or for only a few months of the year.

**Cabinet Eliminating Reds Is New Aim In Indonesia**  
JAKARTA (AP)—Indonesia's new government is reported seeking to form a cabinet that would eliminate all Communist elements.

The military newspaper Angkatan Bersendjata said the cabinet will consist of about 24 members.

It quoted Sri Sultan Hamengkubuwono, a member of the presidium weighing the changes, as saying:

A fresh atmosphere which is free from the PKI (Indonesian Communist party) element has to be created first to enable the cabinet to work for the people's interests, particularly in the fields of food and clothing and regional development.

President Sukarno, whose dictatorial powers have been clipped, has been meeting with the presidium, named last Friday by Indonesia's new strongman, Lt. Gen. Suharto.

The president turned over authority to Suharto March 11 to restore political stability following two months of student demonstrations.

Reliable sources said Suharto has asked unacceptable ministers in Sukarno's former 100-man cabinet to submit their resignations.

These ministers are in addition to the 15 Suharto announced Friday had been taken into protective custody. The 15 include First Deputy Premier Subandrio, Third Deputy Premier Charel Saleh, Education Minister Sumardjo, Electricity Minister Setiadi and Information Minister Achmadi.

The students directed their ouster campaign particularly against Subandrio, whom they charged with being a tool of China.

**CONTRACT BRIDGE**  
1. Two hearts. The principle of anticipation plays a highly important role in bidding. Before a player makes a bid he should look ahead to see whether or not he may be creating a later problem for himself. For example, suppose you respond to the heart bid with a spade and your partner bids two hearts. What now? If you pass, you have failed to show the heart support; if you bid three hearts, you have done too much bidding for the limited values you have. The way to get out of this trap is not to create it in the first place. Just raise one heart to two, indicating 6 to 9 points and a trump fit. That's what you have, and that's what you should bid. The decision on how far to go should be placed right where it belongs—in partner's lap.

2. One spade. One of the hardest things to sell some players is the idea that a suit response in the one level does not necessarily indicate greater strength than a notrump response. A one notrump response ordinarily ranges from 6 to 9 points, while a suit response may have 6 to 16 points, but what is highly significant is that either response may have as few as 6 points. The opportunity to bid a five-card major should not be bypassed merely because the suit is weak. Major suit games are an important target in bidding, and they can be too easily missed if a player does not show a five-card major when he has one.
