Hang Our Heads In Shame, Judge In Texas Declares

AUSTIN, Tex. (AP)—Several hundred mourners gathered in front of the Texas Capitol Monday morning to pay tribute to the late President Kennedy...

Judge W. A. Morrison of the Court of Criminal Appeals said: "We hang our heads in shame because it happened in the Lone Star State."

He said there was no place of welcome in Texas for those of citizens the extreme right of the extreme left.

"We must become better citizens by following the example set by our devoted president. We may then be able to atone for what happened 'Friday in Dallas,' he said.

WASHINGTON (AP)—An eternal flame will burn at the head of the grave of John F. Kennedy at the Arlington National Cemetery Monday.

At the close of the funeral service Monday, his widow lit the torch, helped by the late president's brothers, Attorney-General Robert F. Kennedy and Senator Edward M. Kennedy.

Army engineers said it is fueled by propane gas, as is the eternal flame at the Arlington Memorial on a nearby hillside, site of the Tomb of the Unknowns.

Johnson, De Gaulle Talks Scheduled Early In 1964

WASHINGTON (AP)—President Johnson scheduled his first meeting with foreign and domestic leaders after participating in the Paris summit.

De Gaulle was one of 17 top foreign executives with whom he had private talks during the day but the 18-minute session with the tall Frenchman far outweighed in importance any of the other sessions.

Johnson did not disclose any details of the meeting, if, indeed, any have been agreed upon, but stressed the important diplomatic news obliquely when he apologized for being late for a session with state governors.

He explained he had been meeting with de Gaulle and "we discussed the world situation and talk some more early next year."

Public To Get Assassination Facts In Full

WASHINGTON (AP)—The FBI is preparing a detailed report on the assassination of President Kennedy and all the details will be made public, the White House announced.

The White House directed the justice department and the FBI to conduct a prompt and thorough investigation of all the circumstances surrounding the brutal assassination of President Kennedy and the murder of his alleged assassin.

The White House said John F. Kennedy Jr., three years old, stood at attention and saluted Monday at the funeral of his father on the coffin of his father on the Arlington National Cemetery.

The little boy had just stepped out of St. Matthew's Cathedral, clutching the hand of his mother, the widow of President Kennedy.

His sister, Caroline, also held on to her mother. John Jr. carried a book, probably a prayer book, in his free hand.

A guard of honor of nine servicemen bore the coffin to the caisson. John Jr. looked up at his mother. She whispered to him: "Give her the book."

Suddenly his right hand shot up in a smart salute. The servicemen put the caisson and stepped back, and the little boy dropped his salute, taking the book back from his mother.

WASHINGTON (CP)—Six pipers from the Scottish Regiments of the Black Watch flew here from the southern United States to participate Monday at the funeral of President Kennedy.

They came at the request of the president's widow, Mrs. Jacqueline Kennedy, who with her husband on Nov. 15 attended a concert given by the Black Watch Pipe Band at the south lawn of the White House.

The six pipers fell in at the head of the funeral procession Monday as it left the White House for St. Matthew's Cathedral.
