

Alston Believes Roseboro Can Slow Down Pale Hose

CHICAGO (AP) — Los Angeles manager Walter Alston doesn't expect to slow the "go-go" Chicago White Sox down to a walk but neither does he believe the fleet-footed American League champions will run his Dodgers into the ground.

The usually conservative Alston, who seems to be gaining confidence with each Dodger victory, is convinced he has the personnel to cope with the White Sox' vaunted speed.

In catcher John Roseboro, the Dodgers have just the man who can keep Luis Aparicio, Nellie Fox, Jim Landis and company honest, Alston believes.

"A lot of people don't realize that we have as good a throwing catcher as there is in baseball," he said. "Roseboro is as good right now as Roy Campanella

ever was as a thrower. I think the White Sox are going to be surprised if they think they can take liberties with John's arm.

SEES DANGER
"I'm not in the least underrating the White Sox' speed. Our scouts have warned us there is plenty of run in the Sox, and if we don't keep them glued to the bases it could be costly. But I think my man Roseboro is capable of handling the challenge."

The scholarly Dodger manager made these observations Wednesday less than 24 hours before the start of the world series between the Dodgers and White Sox, which opens today with Roger Craig opposing Early Wynn of the White Sox.

The Dodgers' scheduled mid-afternoon workout at Comiskey Park was called off because Alston felt some rest would do the

players more good. Instead, the team had a squad meeting in the hotel and went over the scouting report on the White Sox.

Alston thinks, too, the White Sox speed boys won't be taking as many liberties against the Dodger outfielders as many believe.

"We've got some pretty good arms in Carl Furillo, Duke Snider and Don Demeter," he said. "Wally Moon has a stronger arm than people think. Only Norm Larker doesn't have a strong enough arm."

Alston plans to go into the first series game with the same lineup that won the pennant clincher against the Milwaukee Braves Tuesday.

"Snider tells me he's able to play," Alston said. "That being the case, he'll be in centre field and will bat fourth. Should Duke's knee act up again and make him unavailable, I'll play Carl Furillo instead. In that case, I'll switch Moon to centre and play Carl in right."

Alston indicated Larry Sherry, the young right-hander who hurled so brilliantly in relief in the Dodgers' first playoff game victory over the Braves Monday, would start the second game against the White Sox.

His current plans are for Don Drysdale, his ace, to open in Los Angeles Sunday with a left-hander, probably Johnny Podres, working the fourth game.

Rocky Works Out; Slims Down To 216

MIAMI BEACH, Fla. (AP)—Former heavyweight boxing champion Rocky Marciano, down to 216 pounds from a high of about 236, confirmed Wednesday that he has been working out in a gymnasium and said "I haven't closed the door" on a comeback.

"Sure, I've had the gloves on hitting the bag in a gymnasium (in Ocala), but I haven't sparred," Marciano said. "If I were making serious moves for a comeback, I'd be sparring, wouldn't I?"

The 36-year-old Marciano, who retired undefeated four years ago, said there's an unusual situation in boxing now.

"There was a big upset in the last fight (Ingemar Johansson's third-round knockout of Floyd Patterson). It changes the picture."

"I haven't closed the door," he added. "How can you not listen when people talk about a million and two million dollars?"

Would he like to fight Johansson?

"That's a tough question. If I were still fighting, sure I'd like to fight him, I never ducked anybody. But right now, that's a tricky question."

Marciano said he had been "playing a lot of golf, doing a little swimming and laying off spaghetti."

Two Coaches Quit Braves

MILWAUKEE (AP)—Two Milwaukee coaches quit Wednesday, one day after the Braves lost the National League playoffs to the Dodgers. Billy Herman apparently had another job lined up, but Del Rice "asked for and received an outright release."

Rice said without elaboration. He has been second string catcher for several seasons, shifted to coaching duties late in the season after he was hurt in a play at the plate. He is 36.

Herman, 50, finished his second season Tuesday under Braves manager Fred Haney. During the entire period he has coached at third base.

Prior to joining the Braves, Herman was a coach with the Dodgers, whose home base then was Brooklyn. He spent most of his playing career with Chicago Cubs.

Although it was sheer speculation, baseball sources suggested that Herman might become a coach under Billy Jurges, manager of Boston Red Sox. They were teammates with the Cubs.
