Quebec Maple Leaves

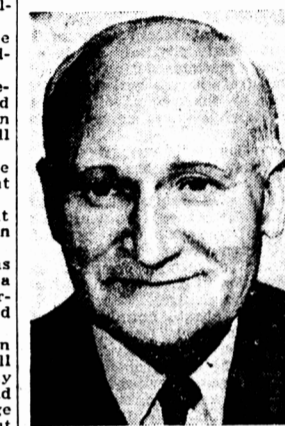

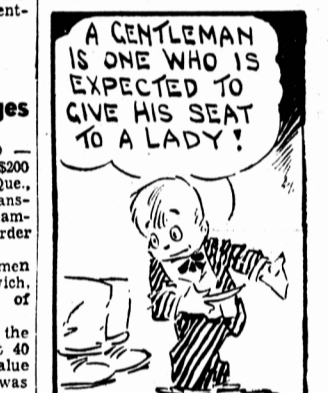
