NEW BUSINESS BUSINESSMAN'S DINNER

John R. MacDonald, president and chief executive officer of Standard Brands Ltd. will be guest speaker at the University of Prince Edward Island's Business Society dinner March 12.

A graduate of St. Dunstan's University, with a B.Sc. in Chemistry, Mr. MacDonald's early business experience was with Acadian Distillers

Limited which he joined in 1959 as a chemist, a position he held until 1962 when he became distilling supervisor. In 1965 he was transferred to McGuinness Distillers Limited, Toronto, as distilling manager and advanced from vice-president (manufacturing) in 1968 to president in 1973; to president of the wine and spirits division of Standard Brands Limited in 1974, and a director of Standard Brands Limited in 1975.

Prior to his appointment as president and chief executive officer of Standard Brands limited in Montreal

in 1977, he was vice-president of International Standard Brands in New York, with responsibility for Mexico, the Caribbean, Central America, the Far East and the Phillipines.

Mr. MacDonald was also chairman of the National Breath of Life Campaign for the Canadian Cystic Fibrosis Foundation.
