APPLICATION having been made to His Excellency the Lieutenant Governor, in Council, for Grants of the exclusive right to fish for Oysters or Oyster Brood, and to form New Oyster Beds, in the following Rivers, viz:—

IN PRINCE COUNTY.

In Dunk River—in the locality shown on the plan thereof, annexed to the said application, and described as follows:—The Eastern boundary thereof, shall be a right line drawn from the extremity of Hurd's Point wharf, to Wilmot Point, Township Number 25, and thence extended to the shore, under or near George Darby's, Township Number 17, the outer or Western boundary thereof, a line drawn from Indian Point Reef, to Welling's Point, Township Number 17.

IN QUEEN'S COUNTY

In the Hillsborough River—in the first division, described as follows:—The Eastern boundary thereof, shall be a line drawn from the Queen's Wharf, Charlottetown, to the Wharf at Minchin's Point—the Southern boundary shall be a line drawn from Block House Point, to Trout Point—the Northern boundary, a line drawn from the Queen's Wharf, to York Point. Township Number 32, and its Western boundary, a line drawn from York Point to Canso Point.

His Excellency in Council has been pleased to order, that grants of the rights and privileges so applied for, be offered for Sale at Public Auction, on Saturday, the 10th day of June next, in terms of the Act of the General Assembly, intituled "An Act to repeal the Act relating to the Oyster Fisheries of this Island, and to make other provisions in lieu thereof."

GOD SAVE THE QUEEN.

HIS Excellency the Lieutenant Governor, in Council, was this day pleased to fix and determine the rate at which the amount of the invoice of dutiable Goods imported into this Island from the United States of America, shall, in estimating the duties payable thereon, be reduced into current money of the Island, as follows:

In all cases where such Invoices shall be made out in Dollars and Cents of the paper currency of the United States, the amount of such invoice shall be reduced into current money of this Island by allowing for each Dollar the sum of Four shillings and eight pence, and in the like proportion for any fraction of a Dollar,—of which all Collectors of Impost are to take notice, and govern themselves accordingly.
