Prime Minister Makes Reply To Letter From Khrushchev

OTTAWA (CP)—Prime Minister Diefenbaker has told Russian Premier Khrushchev that unilateral and conditional decisions to suspend nuclear tests are not a tolerable substitute for international agreement.

The prime minister made public his May 9 reply to Khrushchev's April 4 letter to him urging that Canada use its influence to get the United States and Britain to stop testing nuclear weapons. Russia recently announced a halt in its tests after apparently completing a series of shots.

Mr. Diefenbaker said Sunday night he is disappointed and disturbed at Russia's recent attitude in vetoing in the United Nations a United States proposal for Arctic inspection.

"Personally, I am at a loss to reconcile the Soviet attitude and argument in these (UN Security Council) meetings with the conciliatory tone of your message to me," Mr. Diefenbaker wrote.

SEEKS VIEWS
"I should further like to know whether you are prepared to negotiate seriously on this issue in the immediate future through the United Nations or diplomatic channels, or whether you insist on delaying discussions of these matters until a summit meeting has been arranged."
