Strange But True

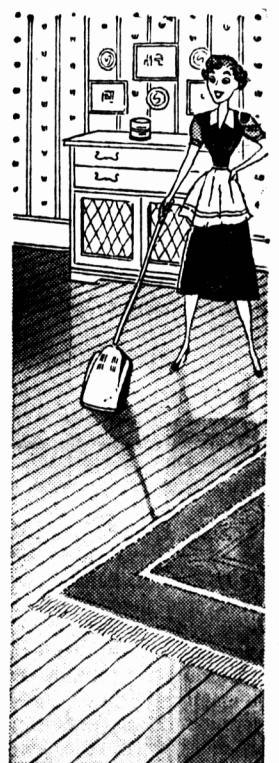
