Upsurge Is Reported In Illegal Lobstering

HALIFAX (CP)—The fisheries department said Monday its protection officers are waging a day and night campaign against illegal lobster fishing in Prince Edward Island.

In a report released through its regional information office here, the department says that the Aug. 10 opening of the lobstering season in a Northumberland Strait portion of P.E.I. has resulted in "upsurge in illegal lobster fishing on the gulf side of Prince County."

Efforts were being made by "hand, sea and air" to check illegal fishing. "Already large quantities of illegally caught lobsters have been seized and liberated." Land patrols try to stop transportation of illegally caught lobsters, while radar-equipped boats and aircraft patrol areas where lobstering gear has been set illegally.

The statement said that the bulk of the illegal fishing is being done by a small segment of Prince County fishermen and most fishermen favor protection of the lobsters.

"There was a 'small amount' of illegal fishing in areas of New Brunswick and Nova Scotia where the lobster season is closed.

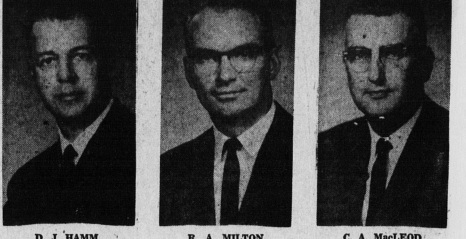
