

# Security In God Preached By Paul

God had filled his soul. The great apostle not only preached a joyous confidence in God, but also practised it in season and out of season. He suffered shipwreck, scourging, stonings, beatings, imprisonment, and martyrdom, but none of these impaired in the slightest his robust faith and stout-hearted trust in his Lord and Redeemer.

On the contrary, they seemed to have increased both as his end drew near, the crescendo of his exalted confidence in God echoed in the last words written in his prison cell:

"The time of my deliverance is at hand. I have fought the good fight, I have finished the course, I have kept the faith. 'For the rest there is laid up for me a crown of justice, which the Lord will deliver me from every work of evil, and will preserve me to His heavenly kingdom; to whom be the glory forever and ever Amen.'"

In these words of St. Paul, we catch his message which has reverberated down through the centuries to men of all ages. In the last 30 years, two World Wars, two depressions, and a half dozen recessions have shaken our world to its very foundations, and banished the complacency, confidence, and easy-going self-assurance, which have long characterized our Western civilization.

These memories of suffering and disaster still haunt us, and with the threat of a thermonuclear war hanging like a sword of Damocles over our worried heads, we can find no relief. We are tense, nervous, jittery, scared stiff at the thought of multi-toned atomic blasts, and the resulting reducing civilization to shambles and converting our planet into a vast concrete inferno.

Millions seek tranquillity through increasing use of alcohol, barbiturates and other so-called tranquilizers. These, at best, yield temporary relief, and after their effects wear off the individual is confronted with the same chronic tensions and fears, often in more acute form.

Since peace of mind and spiritual serenity have their roots in the spiritual realm, it follows that the remedies for the disorders in this domain must be basically spiritual. Long ago, St. Paul learned this lesson. This does not minimize or disparage in the slightest the immense and invaluable service which psychiatry and psychology render to patients with various mental ills. It simply recognizes the large number of cases wherein the loss of peace of mind and serenity of traceable to basically spiritual maladies and where, in consequence, the remedies must be essentially spiritual in character.

**New Church Is Designed For Long Life**  
TEL AVIV (Reuters)—Israel will get a new Roman Catholic church designed to stand for 1,000 years, a foreman at the site said.

## Heirs of the Promise

It is being built here on the spot where it was said an angel appeared to Mary, mother of Jesus Christ, and told her she had risen from the dead. The new church of the Annunciation will be the largest in the Middle East, holding 6,000 worshippers. The first phase of construction will cost an estimated \$2,000,000 alone—the second phase may amount to twice the figure.

The construction site is above a small cave—habited centuries before Christ—and the remains of five previous chapels, basilicas and churches. ITALIAN DID DESIGN

The new building will be one of the most complex structures ever built in Israel and was designed by the well-known architect Giovanni Michelucci of Milan, Italy.

The plan faithfully preserves architectural details uncovered on the site in the last few years, such as an ancient temple dating back to the days of the first Christian community in Nazareth.

The church, being built by the Roman Catholic Franciscan order, will rise on the foundations of an old Crusader church. All cement beams and walls have been made thicker than usual to reduce the need for durable as cement. The new church is designed to stand for 1,000 years, a foreman at the site said.

The basilica, or lower church, will contain some of the finds taken from the ruins of previous temples which have stood on the spot.

The upper church will be crowned with a cupola, which will contain 1,000 tiny oil-lamp holders supporting the cupola, giving it a wide uncluttered area for worship services.

## Presb. Synod Meets Oct. 1

LUNenburg, N.S.—the 90th meeting of the Synod of the Maritime Provinces of the Presbyterian Church in Canada will meet in Fredericton, N.B., starting on Monday, Oct. 1.

Following a service of public worship and the election of a moderator that evening, business sessions will continue through the next two days. About 140 members, ministers and laymen from the four Atlantic Provinces are eligible to attend.

Guests expected to be present include Rev. Dr. Harry Lennox of Vancouver, moderator of the 89th General Assembly of the Presbyterian Church in Canada; Rev. J. C. Cooper, assistant secretary for home missions, Toronto; Rev. DeQuincy E. Ranger, editor of the Presbyterian Review, Toronto; Rev. Professor C. Ritchie Bell, registrar, Presbyterian College, Montreal, and Miss Helen Teet, national secretary for teen-age work, Toronto.

Synod will open Tuesday evening at 7:30 with public worship in St. Andrew's Church, Fredericton, conducted by the minister, Rev. Dr. T. J. Watson. The sermon will be by the moderator, Rev. William Reid of New Glasgow, N.S. who was elected moderator in 1962. The moderator will preside over the business sessions that follow will then be held.

Members of Synod will be expected to arrive in Fredericton on Monday, Sept. 30 for committee meetings that evening and throughout the next day.

## Retarded Adults Can Be Employed, Doctor Reports

WINNIPEG (CP)—Mentally retarded adults can be gainfully employed on a greater scale than is commonly believed, a London, Ont., psychiatrist said Thursday.

Dr. Benjamin Goldberg of the Children's Psychiatric Research Institute said it is a popular misconception that retarded persons are unable to do more than repetitious, simple learned tasks.

However, he said, the ability of the mentally retarded to be vocationally successful is dependent on extensive training requiring co-ordination and support.

He held the sixth annual conference of the Canadian Association for Retarded Children there is insufficient financial, professional, community or even family support to guarantee success.

It is hoped, he said, the ideal program can be translated into meaningful planning on a co-ordinated, federal, provincial and community level.

"There has been considerable impetus given to the development of vocational rehabilitation by the president's panel on mental retardation and subsequent congressional acts."

It would be favorable if this had repercussions on the Canadian scene, he added.
