



MOTHER SAVES EARL TOO YOUNG TO WED FROM PRETTY WIDOW.

LONDON, June 6.—Because he is only twenty, the Earl of Kinnoull was balked in his attempt to marry secretly a pretty widow. She gave the required notice at St. George's Registry, some time ago, but prevented publicity by giving only the young man's family name, George Hay.

When they appeared for the ceremony the Registrar asked for the Earl's birth certificate. This showed he was born March 30, 1902 and the Registrar told him to come back after he had obtained consent of his parents, or after March 30 of next year.

His Mother, Dowager Countess of Kinnoull, refused to give her permission, and said the entry was not legally accurate as it did describe her son as "George Hay otherwise Earl of Kinnoull."
