Wage Boost For Paper Workers

MONTREAL (CP)—Announcement of a two-year agreement embracing wage increases was made jointly Thursday by Canadian International Paper Co., New Brunswick International Paper Co. and the Office Employees International Union (O.E.U.). The union represents about 200 employees in five of the companies' mills.

A general increase of \$8.12 a month, equivalent to five cents an hour, was contained in the new contract. It is effective from May 1, last, to April 30, 1960.

Present basic rates were not announced. The mills affected are located at Trois-Rivieres, Gatineau and Temiskaming in Quebec, Hawkesbury, Ont., and Dalhousie, N.B.

C. S. Volk, vice-president and treasurer of Canadian International Paper and treasurer of New Brunswick International Paper, said the settlement will provide "much desired stability" during the next two years.

Money Is Seen Plentiful For Short Term Investment

NICOSIA, Cyprus (Reuters)—Bloodshed continued Thursday on Cyprus despite appeals by British, Greek and Cypriot leaders.

The appeals were launched by British Prime Minister Macmillan, Greek Premier Karamanlis and Greek Cypriot leader Archbishop Makarios.

Humanity demands that violence must stop," Macmillan said in a statement Thursday from 10 Downing Street. "Killing and wounding and damage to property can do nothing but harm to the interests of all the communities of the island."

As Macmillan issued his appeal, a British soldier and two Greek Cypriots died violently.

The soldier was killed when a bomb was removing from a road near Vathil village in eastern Cyprus exploded. He was the 84th serviceman to die since the Cyprus emergency began in 1955.

STABBED TO DEATH A Greek Cypriot woman was found dead in bed with 19 stab wounds in the Turkish quarter of Larnaca. The quarter was placed under curfew.

Another Greek Cypriot was found dead with his hand blown off after a British patrol opened fire on a Greek mob in Kholerita, western Cyprus. The Cypriot apparently was ready to throw a bomb at the patrol when it went off in his hand.

A total of six persons have died during the last 24 hours—including two Greek Cypriots shot to death Wednesday night by British soldiers attacked by a village mob in Akheritou, near Famagusta.

A Turkish forest ranger was shot to death Wednesday night at Kantara, northeastern Cyprus, by masked gunmen.

Five members of a Greek Cypriot family were arrested in Limassol early Thursday.

There is no official explanation for their arrest but it is believed to be part of the island's roundup of suspects during the last nine days.
