**Foot, And Mouth Disease Poses Problems For Russians**

MOSCOW (AP)—The Soviet Union appears headed for a good winter wheat crop, but an unchecked spread of foot and mouth disease is expected to hold down meat and dairy production, qualified experts said Friday.

These sources said the winter wheat crop probably will exceed the average annual crop of the last five years, but fall short of last year's record harvest. If the trend continues in the far-larger spring wheat crop, informants said, the Russians might be able to get by without purchases in the West for the first time since 1962.

But foot and mouth disease, which struck cattle in the Ukraine last fall and, by some estimates, affected a third of the Soviet Union's 87,000,000 cattle, was reliably reported to have spread south and west into Moldavia. Informants said police and troops were manning checkpoints in affected areas, but still had not been able to bring the disease under control.

**BORDERS ON ROMANIA**

Soviet Moldavia borders on Romania. The average winter wheat crop during the last five years was 25,000,000 tons. Experts estimated the figure this year would be 27,000,000 to 28,000,000 tons. Last year's record crop was 31,90,000 tons. The drop this year was blamed on lower planted acreage.

**Humans Miss Rabies Cases In N.B. Wave**

**Humans Miss Rabies Cases In N.B. Wave**

FREDERICTON (CP) — Dr. J.R. Feindel, director of communicable diseases for New Brunswick, said Friday no cases of rabies have been reported in humans since an outbreak of the fatal disease was discovered in foxes several weeks ago, but two incidents had occurred in which foxes had bitten humans.

In a statement released here by Deputy Minister C.W. Kelly, Dr. Feindel warned the public to avoid direct contact with any wild animal, especially foxes, acting in an unusual manner. Any person bitten by a wild animal under such circumstances should immediately report to a doctor for treatment, he said.

Dr. Feindel said control measures to check the spread of the disease have been put into effect in all localities of the province where the disease has been reported and there was no cause for undue alarm on the part of residents of these localities.

Areas where rabies have been discovered were not specified but earlier reports said two cases were found in foxes in the Fredericton area.

**Folk Songs Book To Be Published**

NEWCASTLE, N.B. (CP) — "Songs Of The Miramichi", a book prepared by folk song collector Dr. Louise Manny, will be sponsored by the town of Newcastle, it was decided at a recent town council meeting here.

The book will contain about 20,000 words, 101 songs and about 12 pictures covering logging operations on the Miramichi around the 1800s.

Dr. Manny says the book was started before the death of Canadian-born publisher Lord Beaverbrook at his request. It was to have retailed at \$9.95 and about 1,200 copies were to be printed.

**U.S. Coal Prices Moving Upward**

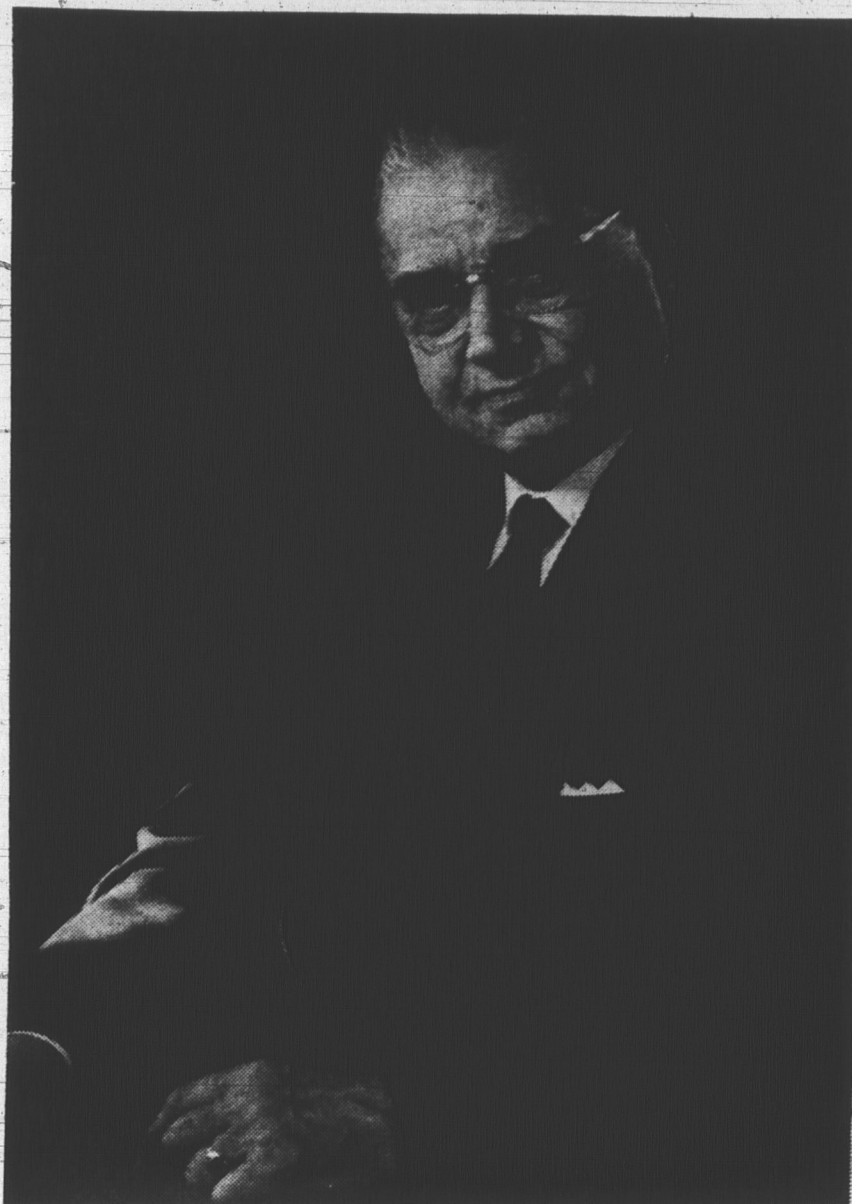
NEW YORK (AP)—U.S. coal producers have announced price increases that are expected to boost costs to users by \$100,000,000 a year.

It was the biggest general price increase in almost a decade.

Indications were that utilities, manufacturers and other users would pass the higher costs on to consumers.

The action is likely to put pressure on utilities to seek higher rates for electric power. More than half the electric power in the U.S. is produced from coal.
