

# Lively Competition In Dancing At Highland Games

Scotsmen gathered from all parts of the Maritimes at the Driving Park yesterday to celebrate the 93rd annual presentation of the Highland Games, sponsored during the Centennial year by the Caledonian Club of P. E. I.

The weather was letter-perfect and Old Sol smiled brightly from above to enhance the multi-colored tarts of the clansmen and dancing lassies and entice a large crowd out to witness the colorful spectacle.

A pair of high-stepping misses from the plaid heart of Nova Scotia captured the open dancing championships and Harold Sutherland of Pictou, N. S., took permanent possession of the Hon. Douglas MacKinnon trophy by winning it for the second consecutive year.

Jeannette MacNaughton of Westville emerged as the Highland Fling champion, winning out over a large field of competitors, and Phyllis MacDonald of Antigonish was second choice of the judge, Mrs. Garden Lawson.

The two young lassies switched roles in the sword dance competition with Miss MacDonald the winner followed by Miss MacNaughton.

Margaret Rhynes of Charlottetown was selected as P. E. I. Highland Fling champ and was also picked by Vice Admiral Lachlan Mackintosh as the best dressed Highland dancer. In the latter competition Sandra MacDonald of Antigonish was second and little Donna Mason of New Glasgow third.

Harold Sutherland also won honor as the best dressed man with Roy MacGillivray of Charlottetown placing second.

The judges had a really difficult task to pick a winner from the two competing bands but finally, after some careful deliberation, they gave the nod to the St. John's Balmoral Pipers over the Westville Dunvegan band.

## French-speaking Educators Meet At Edmundston

EDMUNDSTON, N. B. (CP)—Some 242 delegates from widely-separated parts of the country have gathered for the 7th national congress of the Canadian Association of French-Speaking Educators. Rev. Robert Bernier, rector of St. Louis University, is chairman of the sessions. The deliberations end Tuesday.

Speakers so far have included Trefle Boninger, director of the board of Montreal Catholic schools, and Ronald Vinette of Quebec who is in charge of conference study groups.

The congress theme is: "History, School of Culture and Formation."

One of the most widely discussed addresses delivered to date was that of Marcel Trudel, director of the Laval University Institute of History and Geography.

He told the delegates that "although there is one Canadian nation it would be an error to try to use the distinction between the history of French Canada and English Canada."

## P. E. I. Native Dies At Home In California

Mr. G. Garnet Moore, Whim Road, has received news of the death of his brother, Hayden Lawson Moore, who passed away on July 25, at his home in San Clemente, California, at the age of eighty-four.

The late Mr. Moore was a native of Prince Edward Island, and the son of the late Mr. and Mrs. George Moore of Whim Road. He had a distinguished career in the service of the United States Government. He was collector of customs in Puerto Rico, where he served for thirty-two years. Before his retirement from the customs service in 1930, he was offered the governorship of the Island, but chose to move to the United States with his family.

Mr. Moore was a 32nd degree Mason; a Shriner, and a life member of the San Juan Puerto Elks Club.

Surviving are his wife, Alice, two sons, Hayden and John (both in California), two daughters, Sidney in Boston; and Elizabeth, in New York. His brothers are Melbourne of California, and Garnet, Whim Road, P. E. I.; and two sisters, Ella Barbara, New York and Ida Cecil Montague, P. E. I.
