DECLINE OF BRITISH EXPORTS

How the United States is Exploiting British Trade.

United Competition Telling Upon England.

LONDON, Nov. 24.—The Right Honorable Charles Ritchie, President of the Board of Trade, delivered an important speech before the Chamber of Commerce yesterday, taking as his theme the decline of British exports for the ten months,—upon which he hung a grave warning against the United States competition now ousting British trade. "The facts are serious," he said, "and call upon us for the exercise of all our powers to maintain our position in the commercial world. There is no doubt that the United States are executing many orders which ought to be executed here."

UNITED STATES AND CANADA

The Proposed Commission.

An Understanding Nearly Reached.

OTTAWA, Nov. 24.—At a meeting of the Cabinet, held yesterday, the proposed commission to Washington was under consideration.

It is stated that the two Governments have about reached an understanding, and that very soon a formal communication from the Home Government will reach Washington suggesting the appointment of a commission.

LONDON, Nov. 24.—The Countess of Lathom, returning from a shooting party yesterday, was thrown from her carriage and killed.

LONDON, Nov. 24.—A London cable says that it is more than probable that Lord Strathbrooke will be the commandant of the British artillery team proposed to be sent to Canada next year to compete with the batteries of the Dominion.

LATEST NEWS BY WIRE AND MAIL

LONDON, Nov. 22.—The correspondent of the Daily News says: "I am able to ascertain on the best authority that the powers are discussing the advisability of a naval demonstration in the Dardanelles or a blockade of Constantinople if the Sultan does not yield to the demands of the powers with respect to autonomy for the island of Crete, especially in the matter of withdrawing the Turkish troops."

LONDON, Nov. 22.—The official figures show that 171 buildings were destroyed. The area burned is over two acres. It is still impossible and will be for some time to come to accurately estimate the loss by the fire. The estimates which have up to this time been given vary from \$10,000,000 to \$40,000,000. SAN FRANCISCO, Nov. 22. Details have been received from the Pierre Humbert Alaskan exploring expedition, which sailed from Seattle, Oct. 16th. The party is located ten miles up the river from Chilkat Inlet. The course is being surveyed on both sides of the river, and the explorers have already located a pass over the range, 25,000 feet lower than either Chilkoot or Chilkat. A perfectly feasible and easy route for a railway into the valley of the Yukon has been discovered.

ST. LOUIS, Nov. 22.—Louis Legault has been arrested in connection with the murder of J. B. Laplante on October 30. Guileman, the self-confessed murderer, was confronted by Mrs. Laplante, whom he also accused, and the woman was in no way intimidated. Legault, a neighbor of Laplante's was his assistant in the deed. Officers then allowed Guileman to rush into Legault's house beseeching Legault to save him, as he had escaped, but Legault was not to be caught in that way. He started to kick Guileman out when the officers came to the rescue. Legault, however, has been arrested, and will appear at the preliminary investigation to-morrow.

HAVANA, Nov. 22.—A Spanish force while escorting a convoy of provisions in the province of Santiago de Bares, was fired upon by a detachment of insurgents. The official report says sixteen government troops were wounded.

BERLIN, November 22.—A despatch from Canea to the Cologne Gazette says that the German embassy at Constantinople has notified the international squadron in Cretan waters that a fresh German detachment of marines will be landed shortly to replace the German contingent consisting of an officer and twelve marines, that embarked on the Kaiser Augusta Friday last after the German flag had been hauled down from the international redoubt.
