Tournaments in junior and senior branches will be conducted at regular intervals during the summer. According to present plans at least, tournaments will be held.

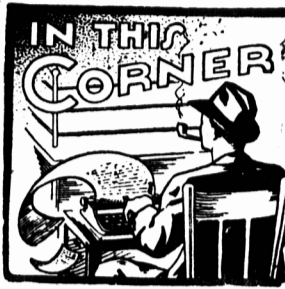

Jack Ready Sets Island League Batting Pace

Jack "Spy" Ready of the Intermediate Abbies, the only player batting over .400 in the Island Baseball League continued his hot pace in the batting race over the past two weeks to increase his average to .412.

Ready, who collected three hits in four trips on Monday night, has 14 hits in 34 official times at bat.

In second place with a batting average of .390 is Rene Gaudet the brilliant centerfielder of the Air Force. Gaudet knocked out six hits in eight trips during the past week to increase his average by 85 points.
