The night of April 17, 1952, brought joy and sadness into the hearts of Mr. and Mrs. Elmer McCourt, of Emerald—joy in knowing that God had called their little nine year old daughter, Beryl, to join His choir in Heaven—sadness in parting with their oldest child and only daughter.

Born at Emerald on January 2, 1943, Beryl became the joy of her parents and later of her brothers and schoolmates. Love seemed to radiate from this little girl to all those, both young and old, who came to know her, with her shy and gentle way.

She attended Emerald school until sickness obliged her to cease just two weeks before her death. All the care that devoted and loving hearts and hands could provide was given, but death came peacefully and quietly in the Charlottetown Hospital on April 17th. Although she suffered intensely for some days, her countenance lit up with a radiant smile just before she passed away. MUSTARD-PICKLE DUMPLINGS

Mix and sift into a bowl, 1 1/2 c. once-sifted pastry flour (or 1 1/4 c. once-sifted hard-wheat flour), 3 tps. Magic Baking Powder, 1/2 tsp. salt. Cut in finely 2 lbs. chilled shortening. Make a well in dry ingredients and add 1/2 c. finely-chopped mustard pickle in sauce and 1/4 c. milk; mix lightly with a fork, adding milk if necessary, to make a drop dough. Drop in 6 portions, over hot cooked stew. Cover closely and simmer (never lifting the cover) for 15 mins. Yield—6 servings.
