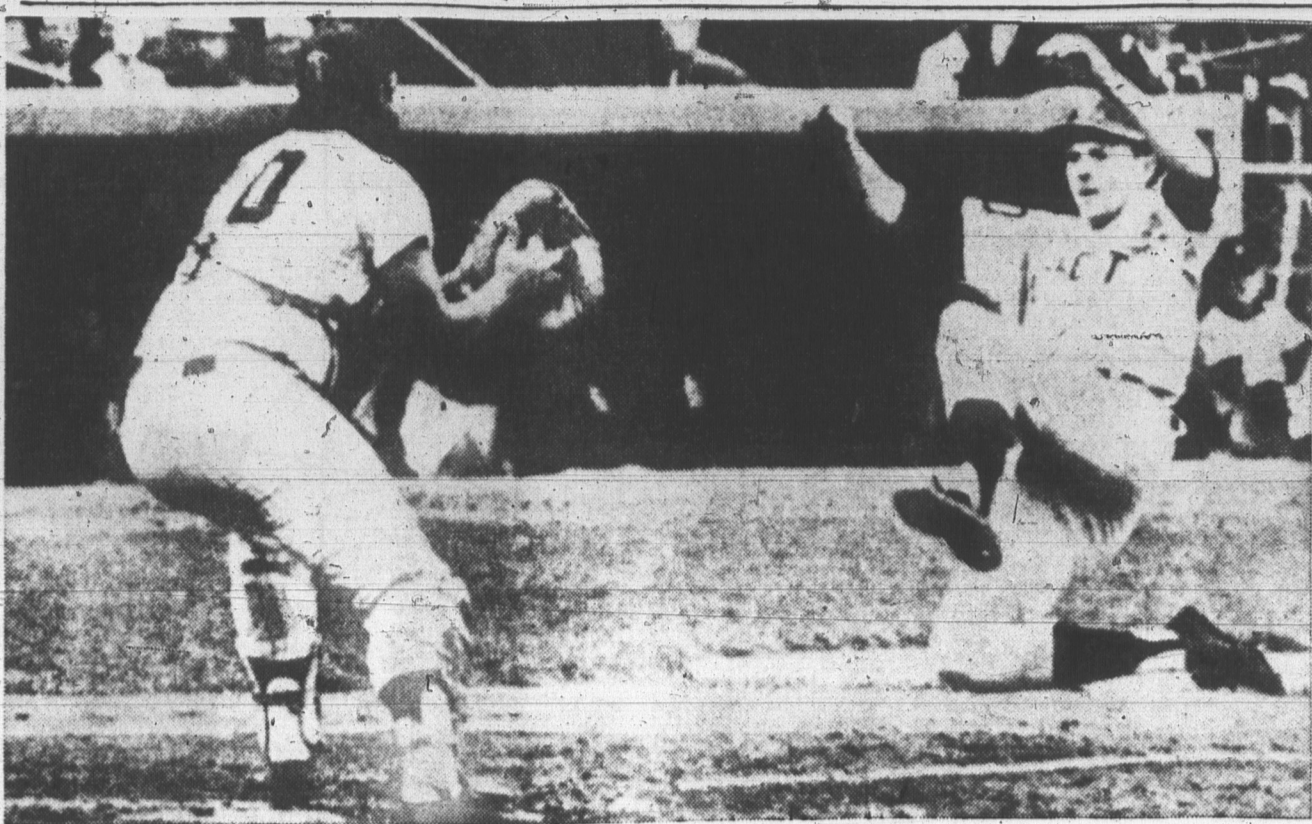
### Spring Is Made To Order For Upland Game Hatching

## Fight To End Turned Down

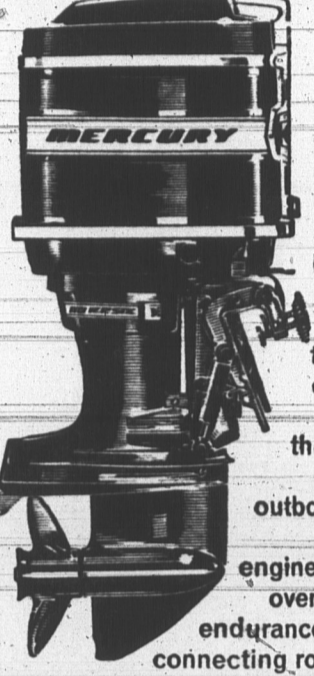

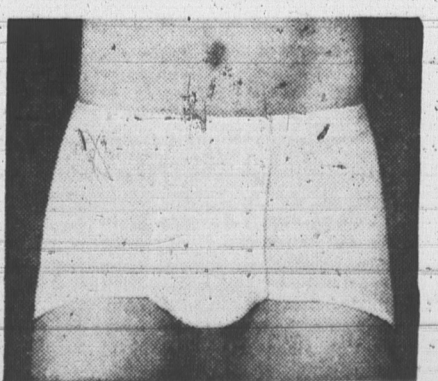
