

National Independence Encouraged By The U.S.

WASHINGTON (AP)—When over a year ago, reports first reached the United States indicating Romania was striving for independence from Moscow, Washington foreign policy strategists picked up their ears. The signs were numerous, but two were outstanding: Romania's uncoincidental neutrality in the Soviet-Chinese quarrel; Romania's firm resistance to Moscow-dictated planning of the economy of the entire Communist bloc.

All this was interpreted here as unmistakable proof of the great weakening of the Soviet Empire's firm resistance to Moscow-dictated planning of the economy of the entire Communist bloc.

At about the same time American spokesmen began to popularize the thesis that the United States should treat different Communist countries differently, depending on their degree of independence from Moscow.

The basis of this philosophy was simple: It is in the American interest that the Eastern European nations be encouraged to exercise the greatest degree of such independence.

OPEN ECONOMIC TALKS

The first practical result of this new thinking is the current series of economic talks with Romanians in Washington. It could be a test case, officials are hinting, and similar talks may follow with other Eastern European nations.

The fact that Washington has invited a high-level government delegation from a Communist country is probably more significant than what is discussed. The agenda is limited. The Romanians want more trade both ways. They are interested in buying the blueprints, and perhaps the machinery, for a modern synthetic rubber plant, and want to be represented here by an ambassador, instead of the minister now heading their diplomatic mission. The U.S. legation in Bucharest would be elevated simultaneously to embassy rank.

The United States agrees with these objectives in principle. Romania, because of its oil resources, is probably the best-off of all the Communist bloc countries, and it can pay for whatever it buys. The exchange of ambassadors would come as a symbolic gesture, provided the talks end successfully.

Romanian trade with the non-Communist world is increasing — from 22 per cent of Romania's total foreign trade in 1958 to 33 per cent in 1962. Trade with the United States is insignificant: \$300,000 in U.S. exports and \$600,000 in imports in 1962.

The talks started last Monday and are expected to be concluded next week.

Mystery Fallout Found Tree Pollen

TRURO (CP) — The fallout of a powdery, yellow material continued late Monday afternoon in a section of Colchester County west of here but it is no longer a mystery.

Tests at the Nova Scotia Agriculture department laboratories here have revealed that the substance is pollen from fir and spruce.

Scientists and residents alike described the occurrence as unusual.

The heavy fallout which coated cars and buildings began Sunday night and continued most of Monday. It was most noticeable in the communities of Debert and Glenholm, about 15 miles west of Truro, and Clifton and Old Bars, on the southwestern outskirts of Truro. At mid-afternoon the heaviest concentration seemed to be at Debert.

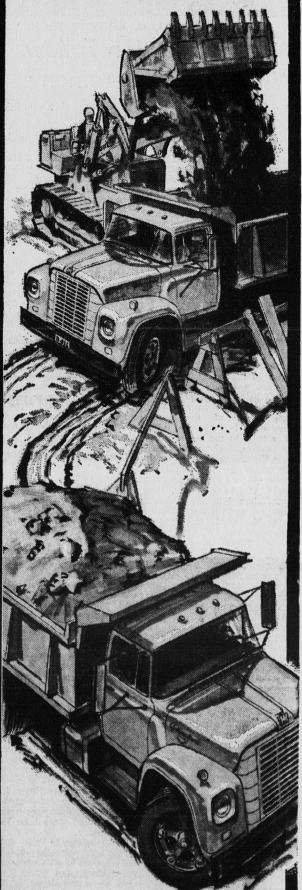

Experiments Are Planned On N.S. Whaling Industry

HALIFAX (CP)—Private enterprise, the federal and provincial fisheries departments and a Norwegian ship are to link up in a four-month experiment this summer to determine whether whaling can be made a practical and profitable part of Nova Scotia's \$70,000,000 fishing industry.

Provincial Fisheries Minister F. A. Manson says arrival of the Norwegian ship at nearby Blandford in early June will launch the first of several planned development programs on the unused or underdeveloped fishery resources in the province.

The Norwegian ship, chartered at a nominal \$6,000 by the federal department, will be under its direct control. Fisheries research board personnel will accompany the vessel on a number of her trips. The vessel's 10-man crew will also instruct fishermen on the techniques of whaling.

Norwegian-born Karl Karlsen, whose Blandford seal processing plant will buy and process the summer's catch, did the possible scouting of some of the locations last year.

\$6,000 SOUTHERN TRIPS
The sealing vessel Minna, a converted Lunenburg, N.S., schooner, made a number of whale-hunting trips in waters between the Grand Banks off southeastern Newfoundland and George's Banks off the southern tip of Nova Scotia.

The Minna's harpoons took an average 15 bottlenecks whales during each two-week trip and the season's process of oil and meat was worth some \$6,000.

Whole oil extracted in the processing is sold principally to the margarine manufacturing markets. Choice cuts of whale meat find a market in New York where they're known as arctic steaks.

Italians Seeking To Reduce Trade Deficit With Canada

OTTAWA (CP)—With every Canadian trade surplus overseas comes not only economic rewards, but a dash of political embarrassment.

Latest case in point is the arrival here Wednesday of Italian Foreign Trade Minister Bernardo Mattarella and six senior Italian government officials.

"Mr. Mattarella will emphasize particularly his country's desire to work towards an improvement in the trade balance between the two countries," says an advance statement by the Italian embassy.

The statement notes that Canada had a \$1,400,000 surplus in trade with Italy last year. His visit is typical of the problems that come with trade surpluses.

In February Trade Minister Sharp had to travel to London to explain Canada's 1963 surplus of \$46,000,000 in trade with the British. He rejected the idea that Canada's anti-dumping laws were to blame.

Now under way are negotiations with the Japanese on their voluntary quotas on exports, officially known as "restraint letters"—on 1964 exports to Canada. Canada's bargaining position is bolstered by last year's \$165,500,000 surplus in trade with Japan.

Name For Child Snowdons Select

LONDON (Reuters) — Princess Margaret and her husband, Lord Snowdon, have chosen the Christian names Sarah Frances Elizabeth for their daughter, who was born May 11, it was announced Monday.

The daughter, who will be known as Sarah Frances Armstrong-Jones, is seventh in line of succession to the British throne.

Reinforced Ship Sails

LAUZON, Que. (CP) — The new refrigerated cargo vessel Blue Peter II, reinforced for navigation in ice, sailed Monday for Montreal, where she will pick up cargo for St. John's, Nfld.

The 1,622-ton Blue Peter II and a sister ship, Blue Cloud, were both completed Saturday at the Davis Shipbuilding yards here. The two vessels are 200 feet long and have a refrigerated cargo capacity of 41,900 cubic feet.

The Blue Cloud is scheduled to sail for St. John's next week. The two ships will be owned and operated by the Blue Peter Steamship Line of St. John's.

DRUNK AND DISORDERLY
LONDON (Reuters) — Sarah, Baroness Audley, 49, the actress daughter of Sir Winston Churchill II, appeared in court here Monday charged with being drunk and disorderly. She pleaded not guilty and the case was adjourned to June 11.

TO WITHDRAW TROOPS
MANILA (Reuters) — Indonesia will begin withdrawing her troops from Malaysian territory in Borneo when the foreign ministers of the Philippines, Indonesia and Malaysia start meeting in Tokyo, June 5, the foreign office announced here Monday.

LONDON, Ont. (CP) — Robert Bainbridge, 21, died in hospital here Monday almost two months after a rare kidney transplant gave him his only chance to live.

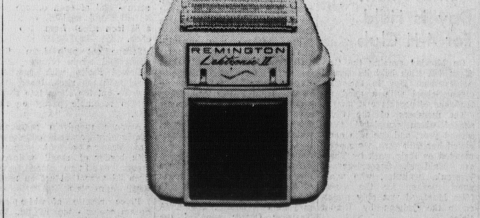
