

Albert Fogarty Leaves For UNB

Albert P. Fogarty, who has been principal of Souris Regional High School for the past two years, will leave the latter part of next week for the University of New Brunswick to complete the course requirements for a master's degree specializing in Canadian history.

Acting principal will be vice principal Roger Solomon, son of Mr. and Mrs. Walter Solomon of Souris.

AWARDED SCHOLARSHIP

In May of this year Mr. Fogarty was awarded a scholarship of \$1600 from UNB. The board of trustees at Souris Regional High have granted Mr. Fogarty a year's leave of absence, with the agreement that he return as principal for at least a three-year period.

Mr. Fogarty is presently on the provincial executive of the P.E.I. Teachers' Federation, is a member of the board of governors, and past president of Souris and Montague locals of the Teachers' Federation.

He will continue at Souris Regional High until September 21, and will return to the island the first week of May, 1967, to finish out the school year.

EXPULSED NUNS REST HONG-KONG (Reuters) Seven elderly nuns, including one from Quebec, who were expelled from Peking, are reported to be resting comfortably in a quiet convent in nearby Portuguese Macao. Roman Catholic Church sources said they will leave in about 10 days for Paris, headquarters of their Franciscan Mission of Mary. An Irish Sister Mary O'Sullivan, 60, died Sept. 1 less than 24 hours after she crossed the border into Hong Kong with the others.

Wilson's Advice To Queen Denounced By London Paper

LONDON (AP)—The Sunday Express denounces as shameful the absence of a message of sympathy from the Queen to the widow of South Africa's assassinated prime minister, Hendrik Verwoerd.

The paper's editor-in-chief, John Gordon, writing in his weekly column, noted that Zambia's President Kenneth Kaunda had cabled Mrs. Verwoerd, saying:

"Your husband and I were irrevocably opposed in public life, but I feel compelled as a Christian to offer you my personal sympathy."

Gordon wrote:

"Many times I have criticized President Kaunda as a troublemaker for Britain. Today I praise him warmly, because he makes British cheeks blush with shame.

"From our Queen no message of sympathy has gone either to Dr. Verwoerd's family or to South Africa.

"Why did she not see her Christian duty as clearly as Kaunda's?"

In an editorial, The Express said:

How characteristic it is of Mr. Wilson's whole policy toward South Africa that he should have advised the Queen not to send a message of sympathy after Dr. Verwoerd's murder.

"Since Mr. Wilson took office, Britain has lost some £300,000,000 (\$900,000,000) in potential South African orders for aircraft, submarines and frigates and electronic and railway equipment.

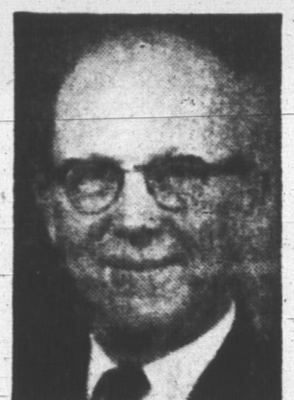

Senator Sees Quebec Premier Easing View On Queen's Visit

MONTREAL (CP)—Senator John Connolly, federal cabinet member and government leader in the Upper House, expressed the belief during the weekend that Premier Daniel Johnson of Quebec will not "stick hard" with statements made about an expected 1967 visit to Canada by the Queen.

Sen. Connolly spoke prior to the departure Sunday for the Atlantic provinces of 200 members of the Commonwealth Parliamentary Association. The members will make a coast-to-coast tour, then on Sept. 25, start a nine-day conference in Ottawa.

The senator is chairman of the association's general council, which met in Montreal Saturday.

Sen. Connolly was asked at a news conference whether he thought Premier Johnson's Sept. 7 statement on the expected royal visit was too aloof.

STATUS NOT UNIQUE

Mr. Johnson said he presumed the Queen would be invited to Expo 67 "just as all heads of state will be invited to it."

Mr. Johnson also said: "There is no question of her being invited to Quebec City."

About the remarks in general, Sen. Connolly said, "I don't think Danny will stick hard on this."

The senator said the Queen enjoys special status in Canada and, therefore, would receive "extra-special treatment" if her Montreal visit materialized.

He was asked whether he had any misgivings about a royal visit in view of the Queen's re-

ception in Quebec City in October, 1964.

On that occasion, the Queen and Prince Philip were heavily guarded and some youthful Quebec separatists were arrested following demonstrations protesting the visit.

The senator said: "The innate politeness of the French Canadians is such that with a visitor like the Queen their reaction is one of emotional pleasure."

TIES STILL STRONG

He and the chairman of the Canadian Commonwealth Parliamentary Association, MP John Turner, who also is a federal minister without portfolio, said they feel Canadian attachment to the Commonwealth is still strong.

The Commonwealth provided a good avenue for understanding of the economic needs of underdeveloped member nations and this in itself gave good reason for maintenance of the group.

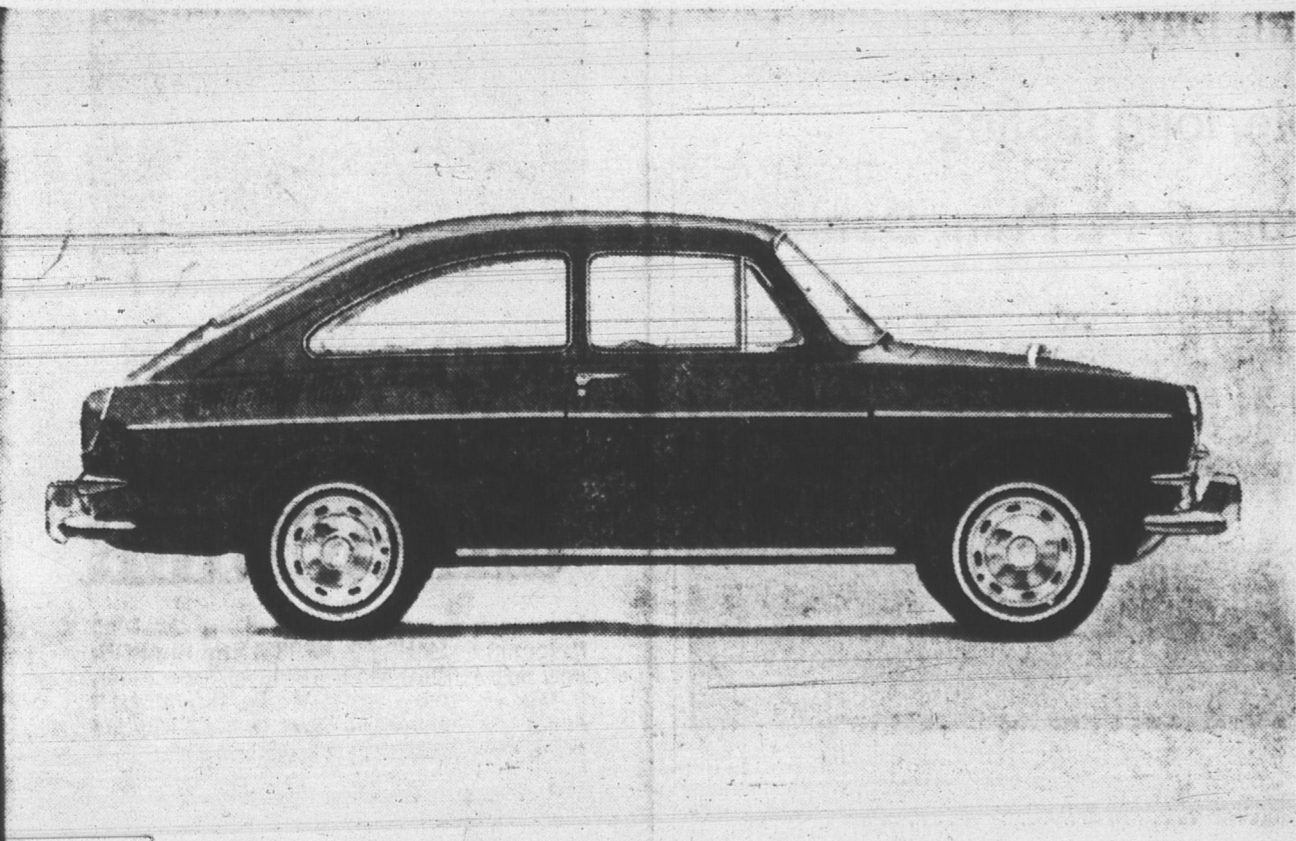
