Expect Trailer-on-Flatcar Shipping To Be Extended

The new high speed trailer-on-flatcar method of shipping is expected to be extended to other Maritime centres besides Saint John, N. B., according to a report by A. Murray MacKay, chairman of the Maritime Transportation Commission at the annual meeting of the Maritime provinces Board of Trade in Charlottetown yesterday morning.

The report predicts extension of the recently introduced "piggy-back" service between Montreal and Saint John, which should prove to be of considerable advantage to our Maritime shippers.

The meeting, presided over by the President, Mr. E. D. Reid, who welcomed the delegates, also heard a report from D. L. Morrell, General Manager, who stated that a trade mission, sponsored by the Canadian Chamber of Commerce, would travel to the West Indies next January in the interest of promoting increased business for Canada.

There are now 102 Boards of Trade and Chambers of Commerce in the Atlantic Provinces, A. T. Parkes, executive secretary of the M. P. B. T., said in his report as he told the delegates of the many fields of endeavour. The work of the M. P. B. T. and results obtained were also outlined.

Greetings were brought from the Atlantic Region Junior Chamber of Commerce by its president John J. Ward who pledged the support of his organization in all the work of the senior group.

The financial report was read by A. I. Barrow, C.A., while a brief review of the work of the Atlantic Provinces Economic Council was given by its president Dr. Frank MacKinnon.

A trade and industry panel discussion by Provincial Ministers of the four Atlantic Provinces will feature this morning's session. With the report of the nominating committee and election of officers to follow.

The City of Charlottetown will be host at a noon reception at the hotel just before the closing luncheon when guest speaker will be D. V. Conder, vice-president and general manager, Atlantic Region, Canadian National Railways. Presiding at the luncheon will be C. R. MacLaggan, president of the Summerside Board of Trade.

9 Men Appear In Police Court

City police court continued to hold heavy Monday morning sessions today when nine men appeared on the docket that faced Magistrate K. M. Martin.

A 23-year-old Fort Augustus man will spend the next seven days in the Queens County jail. He pleaded guilty to a charge of driving while intoxicated. The sentence also calls for a one-year cancellation of the accused's license.

A 22-year-old North Sydney man was remanded until this morning when he appeared on a charge of vagrancy. He pleaded guilty as charged.

A Chestnut Street man, out from a previous sentence on appeal, was fined \$30 and costs or 10 days when he pleaded guilty to a charge of being drunk and incapable. He had been remanded from last week.

A similar offense drew a fine of \$20 and costs or 10 days for a 44-year-old Southport man.

A drunk and disorderly charge against a 44-year-old Dorchester Street man on the complaint of his wife, saw the accused fined \$10 and costs or five days.

Other drunk and disorderly charges drew fines of \$10 and costs or five days for a 30-year-old North Wiltshire man and a Stewart Street resident while a King Street man was fined \$5 and costs or two days on the same charge.

The lone traffic violator, a Milton man, was fined \$10 and costs or five days when he pleaded guilty to going through a stop sign at the Rochford-Kent Street intersection.

DAN ALEXANDER MATHESON

The passing of Dan Alexander Matheson, of Heathdale, occurred in the King's County Memorial Hospital on April 22nd, 1958, in his 70th year.

Greenbelt For Ottawa Planned

OTTAWA (CP) — Government backing to provide Ottawa with a 37,500-acre greenbelt ring curbing urban sprawl was announced Wednesday.

An official of the Federal District Commission, charged with handling the 50-year plan for beautifying Canada's capital, called it a far-reaching decision to assist what may be an international first in urban development.

Prime Minister Diefenbaker said Wednesday in the Commons the government is prepared to loan the money to acquire Ontario land running three-quarters of the way around Ottawa. Parliament's approval will be asked this session.

He set no price but the FDC has spent about \$15,500,000 to date on acquiring land in the greenbelt area and estimated two years ago that buying the remainder would cost in the neighborhood of \$20,000,000. Purchase of the thinly-populated land may be finished in several years.
