NEW YORK (AP)—The stock market put on a contradictory performance Monday. Losses of individual stocks more than doubled gains—but the Dow Jones industrial average ended the session with an advance.

The Dow industrials put on an erratic performance before they ended with a gain of 1.28 at 992.15. At 12:30 p.m. EDT the Dow was down 2.20, a steep drop. The indicator recovered swiftly.

The Associated Press average of 760 stocks dropped 3 to 328.1. Hudson Bay Mining and Walker Gooderham fell a point among Canadians. Canadian Pacific and International Nickel were off 1/2 and Dome Mines lost 3/4.

Prices were generally lower on the American Stock Exchange. Scurry-Rainbow Oil slipped 1/4 and Canadian Javelin 1/2.

MONTREAL

MONTREAL (CP)—Stocks were lower with the exception of banks Monday on the Montreal and Canadian stock exchanges. Trading was moderately active.

Industrial volume was 401,200 shares and mines and oils 1,925,000.

The composite index was off 1.4 at 158.5. Industrials were off 1.8 at 164.9. Chemcel dropped 1/2 to 17% and CIL 1/2 to 22%. Canada Cement rose 1/2 to 55 1/2. Utilities were off 0.8 at 149.3. Nova Scotia Light dropped 1/2 to 32 1/2. Brinco advanced 1/2 to 7 1/2 in heavy trading.

Papers were off 1.2 at 133.2. Dominion Tar lost 1/2 to 20 1/2. Fraser 1/2 to 33. MacMillan-Bloedel fell 1/2 to 32.

Provincials added 1/2 to 128.0 and Royal 1/2 to 76 1/2. Montreal and Imperial Commerce each dropped 1/2 to 64% and 66% respectively.

Machinery issues slipped with Masses-Ferguson down 1/2 to 30% and CAE 1/2 to 18 1/2.

Metals were lower. In the base section, Consolidated Mining and Smelting fell 1 1/2 points to 42% and International Nickel 1/2 to 95. In the primaries, Aluminum dropped 1/2 to 31 and Algoma 1/2 to 70%. Dominion Steel was off 1/2 to 15 1/2.

Among speculative mines Jubilee Iron fell 25 cents to \$3.65 and New-Imperial 14 cents to \$2.10.
