### A Gentleman Apologizes.

LONDON, Nov. 14.—Lord Rosslyn, in view of Lord Roberts' denial, has written to the Prince of Wales regretting that he was misinformed and tendering an apology in the following language:—

"I owe to the regiment whose honor my publication of a groundless report has called in question, the deepest and fullest reparation. I offer it to you, sir, as colonel in chief. I offer it to every officer, non-commissioned officer and man, and I sincerely trust this unqualified apology will be accepted in the spirit in which it is offered.

### Colonel Otter's Report.

OTTAWA, Nov. 13.—Several South African reports were received at the militia department to-day. Colonel Otter reports that he has been able to locate the graves of all the Canadian officers and men killed or died in South Africa except those of Private Mullins, Private Duhamel and Private Barr. He quotes complimentary allusions to the Canadians of Gen. Smith-Dorrien, which he thinks is a full justification of his administration of the regiment. At the date of writing, Oct. 6th, the parade state was 218, and the total number of the first contingent in South Africa was 378.

### HORROR IN CHINA.

Russia's Terrible Revenge.

LONDON, Nov. 13.—The Globe this afternoon publishes a letter from a Belgian gentleman, who has been travelling to Peking via the Trans-Siberian railroad. He describes, under date of September 6, what he saw in the Amur river. His account surpasses in horror those previously published.

"The scenes I have witnessed during the three days since the steamer left Blagovetchensk," he says, "are horrible beyond the powers of descriptions. It is the closing tableaux of a fearful human tragedy. Two thousand were deliberately drowned at Morro, two thousand at Rabe and eight thousand around Blagovetchensk, a total of 12,000 corpses encumbering the river, among which were thousands of women and children. Navigation was all but impossible. Last week a boat had to plow her way through a mass of corpses lashed together by their long hair. The banks were literally covered with corpses. In the curves of the stream were dark masses of human flesh and bones surging and swaying in the steamer's wake and wash. The captain vainly ordered full speed ahead. The sight and smell will be ever with us. From Blagovetchensk to Aigun, 45 kilometres, numerous villages studied the bank, with a thriving industrious population of over 100,000. That of Aigun was 20,000. No one will ever know the number of those who perished by shot, sword and stream. Not a village is left. The silence of death was around us. The smoking ruins of Aigun on the right, with broken down, crumbling walls, and shattered, roofless houses."

### Remarkable Operation.

TORONTO, Nov. 14.—A patient in the General Hospital had a most remarkable operation performed on him the other day. He was suffering from spreading gangrene. Not a vestige of his legs remains and the bones in the hips were removed the spinal cords being closely approached. The greatest difficulty lay in serious injury to the nervous system. The man will probably recover, and it is proposed to rig him with an apparatus which will give him the power of locomotion. It is said the operation has only been performed once before, in a London hospital.
