

Charges Laid Against No. Ontario Gas And Officers

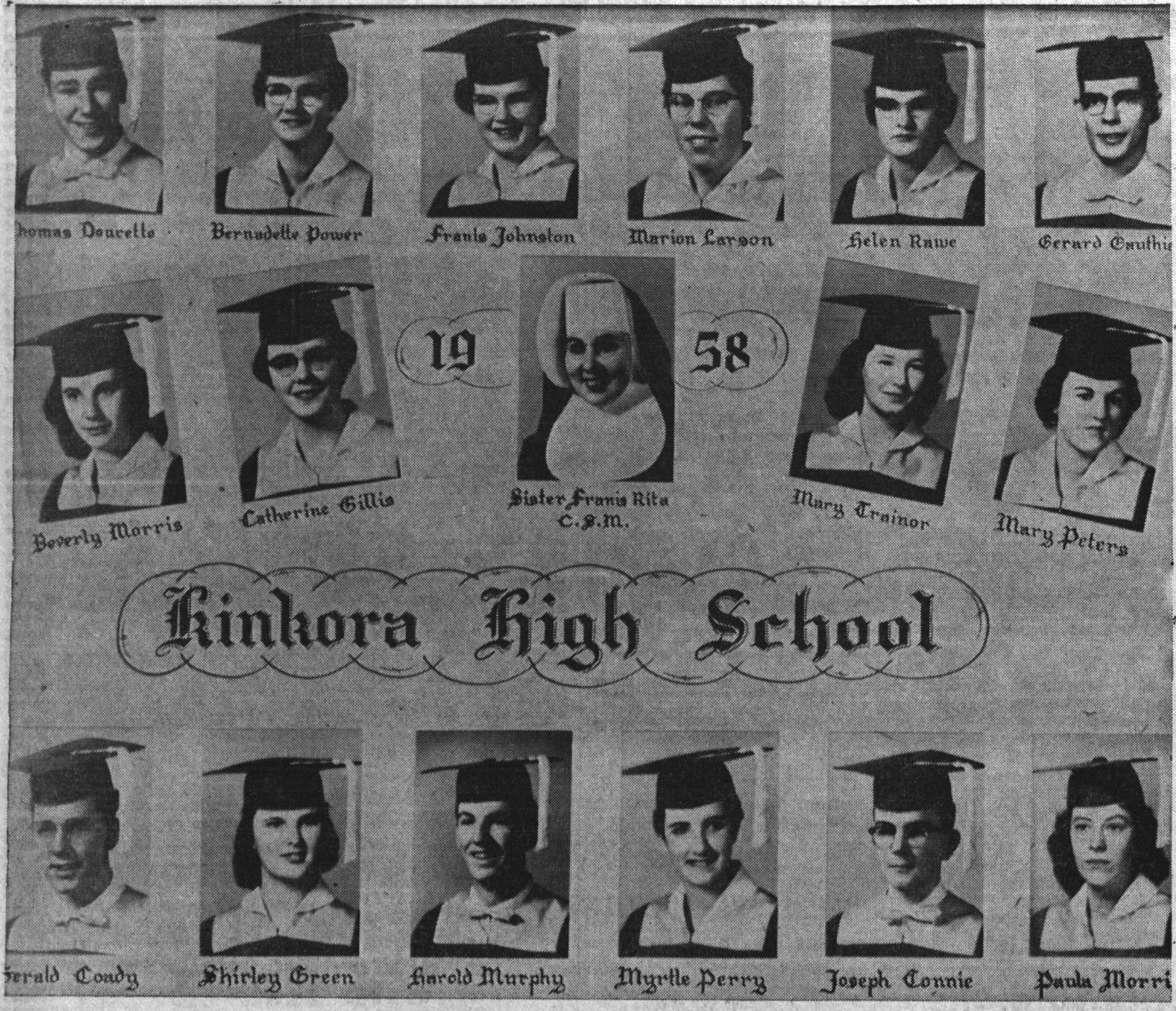
TORONTO (CP) — Charges against Northern Ontario Natural Gas Company Limited, three of its officers and one former officer were laid Tuesday by the Ontario Securities Commission. The charges, under the Ontario Securities and Corporations Acts, involve trading in NONG shares. Attorney-General Roberts announced last week after an investigation of the company that charges would be laid.

Three provincial cabinet ministers have resigned in the Northern Ontario controversy amid disclosures they held shares in the company.

Five informations were sworn out by the commission before Justice of the Peace John Little in Toronto Magistrate's Court. They covered 13 charges—three against the company; four against its president R. K. Farris of Vancouver; four against its vice-president, C. Spencer Clark of Seattle, Wash.; one against Herbert L. Mackenzie of Calgary, a former officer; and one against N. C. Deans of Toronto, a director.

The informations allege:

1. That Farris and Clark were "knowingly responsible" for trading by Northern Ontario Natural Gas in its own account in securities issued by an industrial company;
 2. That the company traded on its own account in securities without first filing a prospectus and obtaining a receipt (Farris and Clark were included in this information);
 3. That Farris, Clark and Deans failed to insure that the company kept proper account books and records;
 4. That Mackenzie failed to keep proper account books and records;
 5. That Farris and Clark caused 14,000 shares of the company to be issued to Continental Investment Corporation Limited in the name of Convesco at \$2.50 a share, and that they caused 1,000 shares to be issued to F. E. Shaw.

WELLINGTON MURPHY
On Friday, May 23rd, 1958, the citizens of Charlottetown and South Shore, were saddened to hear of the death of Wellington Murphy. About a month previously they had heard he suffered a severe stroke and was removed to Charlottetown Hospital for expert care and treatment.

All that medical care and expert nursing could do was done, but God had decided otherwise and he passed peacefully away on the above mentioned date, fortified by the rites of the Roman Catholic Church, his soul took its flight to meet his Maker.

The many beautiful flowers, tributes, mass cards, telegrams, and letters of sympathy bore a silent token of the esteem for one who will long be remembered in the community.

His wife, Mary Ellen Quinn, predeceased him thirteen years ago, also one daughter Ella.

There are left to mourn, one daughter Lauretta (Mrs. Linus Monahan), Charlottetown, and also one brother Alf, in Western Canada; and five grandchildren.

The funeral which was very largely attended was held Monday, May 26th, from his home to St. Martin's Church, South Shore where Requiem High Mass was celebrated by Rev. Father Doyle, C. S. R., who also conducted the service at the grave.

Liberal Opposes Northland Plans

OTTAWA (CP) — Development of the old shallow-draught waterway linking the St. Lawrence River with New York City via Lake Champlain was cited Tuesday by Lucien Cardin (L-Richelieu-Vercheres) as the type of project of benefit to both Canada and municipalities.

The municipalities should not be forgotten, he said in opening the second and final day of Commons debate on national development.

Canada's settled areas contained too many urgent development problems themselves to warrant a rush of large-scale northern development at this time.

Hundreds of populated sectors need tunnels, bridges, roads and other improvements, Mr. Cardin said, taking issue with government plans emphasizing northern exploitation.

He mentioned as an example the canal from Sorel, Que., to New York, which has been deepened to a 12-foot draught in some places but restricted to smaller craft along other sections.

The Conservative government had indulged in a "very dangerous policy," Mr. Cardin said, in putting forward a billion-dollar development program in the last election campaign. It had been a collection of "cleverly-worded half-truths" deliberately used to sell the idea that the plan was new.

Old Colony Rail Branch Closes

BOSTON (AP) — A railway which for many years served a large and populous commuting area south of Boston—the Old Colony—died Tuesday night.

On its branches are such historic communities as Plymouth and New Bedford, and Cape Cod towns.

The Old Colony branch of the New Haven Railroad, parent organization, made the announcement as the state legislature struggled with a bill designed to keep the Old Colony alive by paying the road \$900,000 toward losses in the next 12 months.
