If any one attempts to tax your produce (as the last Assembly had attempted), who more interested than myself in resisting such an innovation? If any thing can be done to better your condition—to open to you better or more extended Markets, who so interested as I am? The attempt that is daily made by ignorant, needy and dissipated individuals, to separate you from me, will indeed be futile, if there is that mutual confidence which, I trust, neither I nor any member of my family have done anything to forfeit.
