

Car Jumps 35-Ft. Embankment Driver Suffers Broken Wrist

Horace Dawson of Cape Traverse is recovering from facial cuts and a fractured wrist sustained Friday about 1 a.m. when the 1951 Chev sedan he was driving left the highway, caromed along and over a steel guard rail on a 35-foot embankment and hurtled about 90 feet through the air before striking the ground, somersaulting at least once before coming to rest, a total wreck in the vegetable garden of Mr. and Mrs. William A. Jones. It is believed that the driver fell asleep at the wheel while proceed-

ing westward on the highway towards his home. Mrs. Jones went to nearby neighbour to summon medical aid and notify the Border detachment of the R.C.M.P. After providing preliminary aid, Dr. Peter MacDonald of Craipaud, took the patient to his office for further medical attention, after which he was allowed to return to his home. Mr. Dawson was the only occupant in the car he was driving when the accident occurred.

Legion Considers Acquiring The Summerside Raceway

The possibility of the Summerside branch of the Canadian Legion purchasing the Summerside Raceway is being explored by a committee of the Legion executive who will report their findings to a meeting of the whole executive this evening. A preliminary survey of the raceway which has been conducted by the executive committee would be involved in the purchase of the beautiful Summerside Raceway which was offered for sale this week, is composed of the president of the Summerside Legion, Lorne Monckey; the secretary, manager of the branch, James Hogan; and a past president and member of the executive, Earl Cannon. The membership of the Summerside Branch of the Canadian Legion is in excess of 400 and their modern, two-story legion home is located on Water Street, opposite the C. N. R. station. The Summerside Raceway is presently owned by a limited company in which G. B. Sheen, H. E. Gaudet, Andrew Perry, and J. K. Curran are interested. It was constructed for over \$800,000 and officially opened on July 1st, 1953, by the Prime Minister of Canada, the Hon. Louis St. Laurent. The grandstand has a seating capacity of about 2,500 persons and stable accommodations for about 150 horses. When built the raceway was valued at about \$125,000.

E. I. trains are of the diesel type.

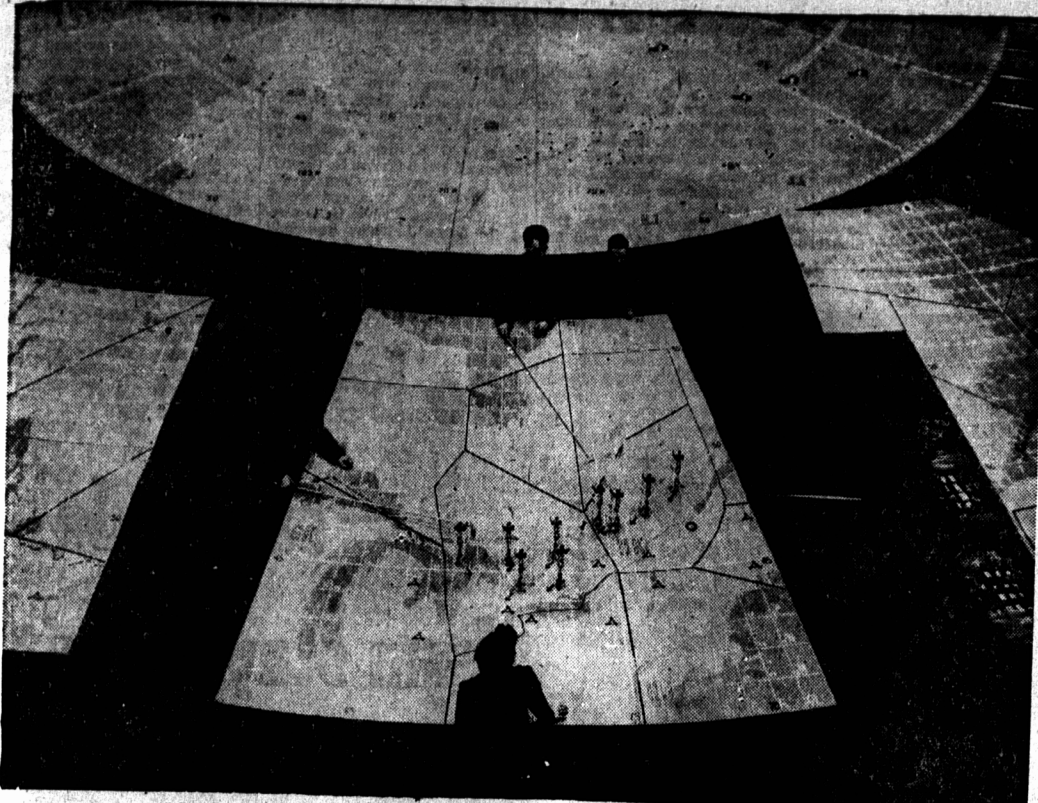

Former Islander Will Be 100 Years Old Sunday

His many friends in Prince Edward Island will be interested to know that a former Islander, Mr. Tremaine Lea of Victoria, B.C., will be celebrating his 100th birthday on Sunday, August 5th. Born in Tryone, P.E.I. in 1856 Lawrence Tremaine Lea, who was named for one of the Island's early doctors is the youngest and last surviving one in a family of twelve of William Lea and Elizabeth Leard. He was married on Christmas Day 1882 to Annie Reid, who predeceased him some years ago. He is also the last surviving grandchild of Richard Lea and his wife Mary Burn of Lincolnshire, England who with their family came to P.E.I. in 1800.
