Fisheries President Delivers Address

Recommendations of some measure of assistance for those lobster fishermen who experience a poor season in the western waters of the Island were made by S.H. Burhoe, president of the Prince Edward Island Fisheries Federation, as he reviewed the activities of the Federation yesterday.

Speaking to the annual meeting of the P.E.I. Fishermen's Federation, Mr. Burhoe yesterday proposed a longer range plan of assistance.

"Most are familiar with the so-called fishermen's bounty. In total, it amounts to some \$160,000 annually. Individually, only about \$10 per fisherman who qualifies. This money is the interest on a sum of money deposited more than a half century ago by our neighbors to the south for fishing privileges in Canadian waters. This was the

money to the Canadian government to distribute as they liked. SYSTEM OUTDATED

"The present system may have seemed suitable when it was first started, but it would seem an outdated method today."

Mr. Burhoe suggested: "Since the federal government may change the use of these funds at will, that we ask for yearly funds (which is the interest on the principal) to be accumulated into a fund which could be used for such purposes as we find need for among our fall lobster fishermen."

DISASTER FUND
 "This money could form a disaster fund, or could be used to set up a housing plan for aged fishermen."

"One interesting comment regarding the 12 mile limit. Iceland has fought for and gained international recognition of a 12 mile limit, and recent reports of landings would indicate that the reserving of this coastal area for national fishing boats only, has lessened the fishing pressure and fish stocks have bounced back in a very surprising way, or so it would seem, because this report is based purely on commercial landings and not on biological data," stated Mr. Burhoe.

Two Vehicles In Collision

Two vehicles which were involved in a collision on the Trans Canada Highway Sunday were reported by the Charlottetown Detachment of the RCMP to have received extensive damage.

Reports indicated that a 1966 Mustang, operated by Augustus Longaphie, and a 1964 Studebaker driven by James Joseph Leightner, both of Charlottetown, collided in the vicinity of North River.

Mr. Leightner was reported to have received facial lacerations, while Mr. Longaphie was uninjured. The cars were headed in opposite directions at the time of the collision. Further details were not available.

Magistrate Remands Accused

Magistrate James B. Johnston, QC, remanded Chester Matthews, New Wiltshire, to November 4, when he appeared in Queens County Court yesterday morning on a charge of having care and control of a motor vehicle while his ability to do so was impaired. The accused pleaded not guilty to the charge.

John Affleck, Mount Stewart was charged with assault. The accused was fined \$25 and cost or 30 days. He was also warned by the Magistrate that he would lose his freedom if he should come before him again on a similar charge.

George Alexander MacDonald, Blooming Point, was fined \$10 and costs for having a unsealed fire-arm in his possession in the National Park at Blooming Point.
