WINNIPEG, Nov. 15 - (CP) - Prices showed a firm trend on Winnipeg Grain Exchange today, especially in December barley and all rye futures. There was fairly aggressive commercial demand for oats and barley. Fair support for oats came from United States houses. Barley and rye also were bought by American interests, but to a lesser extent.

Processors were buying flax. Hedging sales were fairly liberal especially in the deferred contracts, but they were well absorbed. The trading was moderately active. Class two and I.W.A. wheat prices were down one-half cent across the board. No export allocations of wheat were reported.

And that is what made this writer wonder a bit at the recent convention of the Canadian Exporters' Association in Ottawa, when he saw a group of girls in steady attendance at every session. On inquiry, he found these girls are very much in the export business; and they think it a fascinating career.

The girls he talked to were Muriel I. Johnson, export department, Canadian Kodak Co., Ltd.; Verna Thompson, supervisor of documents, export division, Coleman Lamp and Stove Co., Ltd.; and Helen Stewart, supervisor, customs and traffic department, Amalgamated Electric Corporation, Ltd. all of Toronto; while also there were Wynne Hatfield, G. Farm Prices

OTTAWA, Nov. 15 - (CP) - Prices for farm products declined slightly in September, due largely to lower grain prices, the Bureau of Statistics reported today. The Bureau said its index, calculated on the basis that 1939-39 farm prices equalled 100, eased to 246.7 for September, compared with 251.8 for August, and 251.2 for September, 1949.

Lower grain prices, it added, occurred particularly in the Prairie Provinces, where severe frosts and adverse harvesting conditions reduced the average grade of the wheat crop. This decline was offset to some extent by slightly higher prices for livestock and seasonally higher prices for eggs.

Index numbers for Prince Edward Island, New Brunswick and the three Prairie Provinces showed declines from August and September last year, while those for Quebec, Ontario and British Columbia were higher. The index for Nova Scotia declined from August but was above September, 1949.

Index numbers for the Provinces in September follow with those for August in brackets: Prince Edward Island, 199.4 (217.6); Nova Scotia, 209.2 (210.1); New Brunswick, 227.0 (230.4); Quebec, 266.2 (264.3); Ontario, 276.6 (276.1); Manitoba, 242.9 (245.6); Saskatchewan, 200.8 (218.8); Alberta, 246.3 (263.0); British Columbia, 269.9 (256.4).

NEW YORK, Nov. 15 - (CP) - The Canadian dollar was up 3-10 of a cent at a discount of 3 1-2 per cent in terms of United States funds in closing foreign exchange dealings today. The pound sterling was unchanged at \$2.80 1-8.

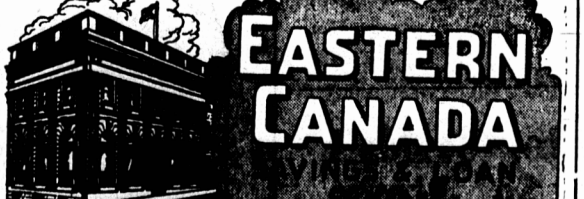
