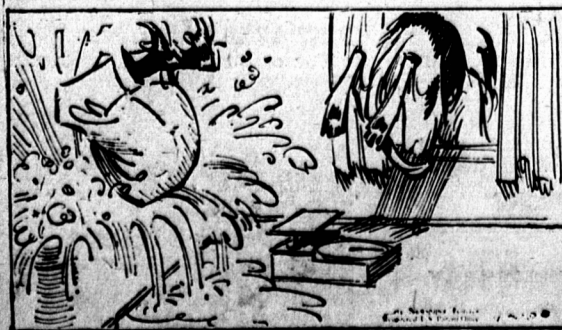

North East South West  
Pass Pass 1 NT 2 ♠ (!)  
2 ♠ (!) Pass 2 NT Pass

The part-score situation explains. but in no sense, excuses, North's bidding. He should have jumped at the chance to double the club overall!

South, luckily for himself, decided that he would not let the opening lead go through his club holding, and so bid two notrump.

West doggedly opened his fourth-highest club. South cashed both the ace and queen of clubs, then led a heart. West won with the blank ace and shifted to the jack of diamonds, to cover dummy's ten. South played low, confident that West would think he had "found his partner," but when West continued with a low diamond, South captured East's king.

Now declarer led another heart to dummy, and East had to hold up his king lest the enemy win two tricks in the suit. At this point it was tempting for South to cash the club king, since he might never get back to make it, but he resisted this temptation—to cash the king was tantamount to surrendering the contract. Instead, South led a spade to the king.

West won the trick and, having observed East's high spade, returned the suit. South won, cashed the diamond queen—thus exhausting East's cards in that suit—then reading the position perfectly, threw East in by leading another heart. East had no choice but to take his heart king, and then, with dummy reduced to the high heart and the club king, East had to give dummy the two tricks which fulfilled the contract.

At that, however, it would have been better for North-South to pick up 800 points by doubling the club bid!
