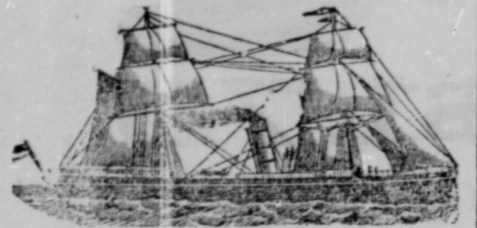

**English Churchmen's Duty.**

Dr. Creighton, the Bishop of London, has issued a letter to the rural deans in his diocese, and he has given them till October to think it over. He reminds his clergy that the Archbishop of Canterbury, after full enquiry, has concluded that there is no authority for the ceremonial use of candles and incense in English Church worship. This being so, it is the duty of all to abandon these usages, which the Bishop drily observes, are not essential and are an offence to many. "I know," he goes on to say, "that habits count for much in all things pertaining to divine worship, but I feel sure that clergy and people will recognize the duty of obedience to authority and the duty of not offending their brethren.
