

## London Receives Fine, Suspension

LONDON (AP) — Brian London was suspended for six months and fined \$2,500 Wednesday for going to the United States to fight heavyweight champion Floyd Patterson. London said he would appeal although he did not intend to fight in England again.

The British Boxing Board of Control, ruling body for pro boxing in the British Isles, took the action after London defied its ruling. The board had refused to give London permission to go to the U.S. for his May 1 title match with the world champion. London was stopped in the 11th round.

**HEAD FOR U.S.?**

"I will probably go to the States and never fight in England again," said London after the hearing. "It is one of those things."

Exact financial figures never were revealed on the Indianapolis fight but London reportedly was guaranteed \$50,000, plus expenses.

After he returned to London he disclosed in a signed newspaper article that he had been promised a second crack at Patterson's title within 18 months.

The board never announced officially why it did not want London to fight Patterson. But many British newspapers and fans said it was because the board felt London was not in a class with the champion and would bring no credit to British boxing.

London was a 10-1 underdog and didn't win a round on the card of referee Frank Sikora.

## Hart Defeats Isaac Logart

CHICAGO (AP) — Sugar Hart, No. 1 world welterweight contender, battered Cuba's Isaac Logart into a bleeding mess for a unanimous 10-round decision in Chicago Stadium Wednesday night.

Hart, from Philadelphia, used his wicked left hook like a surgeon's scalpel to pound his game foe into submission.

Although bleeding profusely from a gash over his right eye from the fourth round and a slash on his lip in the seventh round, Logart was scrapping furiously as the televised bout ended.

Hart, a 2 to 1 favorite, never was in trouble but had the fourth round taken away from him because of a low blow.

**THE SCORING**

Referee Wally Brightmore voted for Hart, 49-44. Judge Harold Marovitz saw it for Hart 48-41 and judge Frank C. Clark gave it to the lanky Philadelphia scrapper, 46-45. The AP card had Hart winning, 49-42.

In the fourth, Logart twice bowed low, as if in pain, from

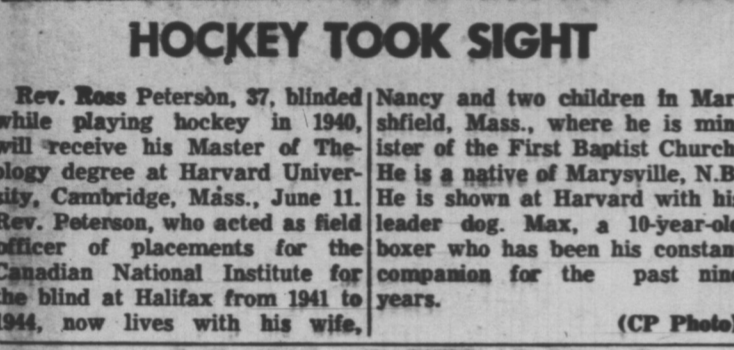
