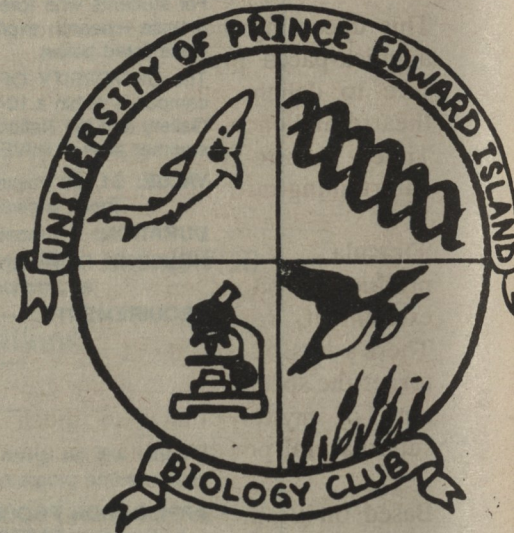
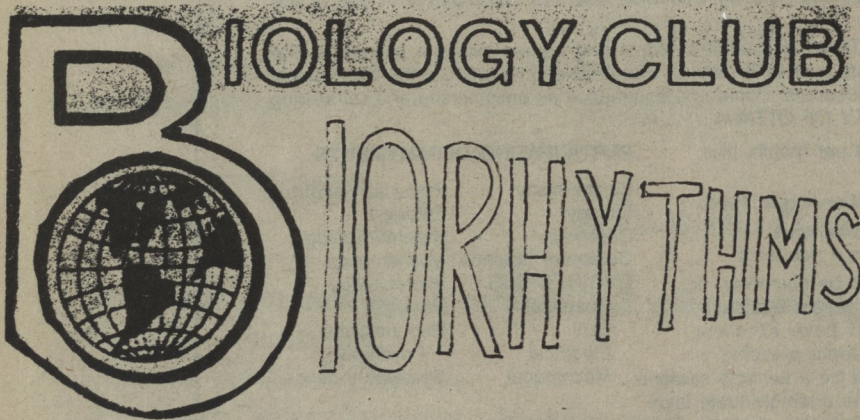
Regular meetings on Wednesdays (Modern Languages lounge - 3rd Floor Main) 12 o'clock. Open to anyone and everyone interested.
