## Island Animals Clean Up At Pictou Area Exhibition

A half-dozen Island cattle breeders completed a most successful invasion of Nova Scotia exhibitions when they cleaned up a large portion of the prizes in the Pictou-Colchester County exhibition yesterday at Pictou. They showed strongly last week at Truro, N.S.

Sterling Wood and Son, Mt. Herbert and Fulton Sanderson and Sons, York Point, took every championship and top prize available.

The Sandersons' Hereford herd took all eight top prizes in individual sections. They took the top male championship and the reserve, and they also had the grand female and the reserve grand.

The Sandersons had two seconds — they were allowed to show two animals in two sections and they placed first and second in both of them.

They took six special prizes. There were many special prizes at the Pictou fair, the Sandersons said last night.

The Woods have Dual Purpose Shorthorns, and they also took every top honor available. They had the champion male and the reserve male; they had the junior champion female and the reserve junior champion, the senior female champion and the reserve and the grand champion female and reserve.

It was their junior champion female, by the way, that went on to become the grand champion.

(There are junior champions and reserve in the Dairy Classes there is only the one female champion and reserve in the beef classes.)

The Woods had eight firsts and two seconds, with the seconds coming in the sections in which two entries were allowed.

Boyd Dixon and his son, Mack were showing their Angus cattle and they also dominated the show. They had five first place ribbons. The Dixons had three seconds and two-fourths.

They also had the grand champion female and reserve. Lester Rankin and Son, Buxbury, had the champion Angus bull of the show. They had one first, four thirds and one sixth.

Irving MacDonald, York, had the reserve champion male. He had one first place, three seconds, two thirds and one sixth.

Boyd Dixon, Clyde River, had one animal in the show. She was two-year-old Dual purpose Shorthorn heifer and she placed second.

### Weekend Traffic Is Brisk As Fine Weather Complies

Fine weather on the last holiday weekend of the season prompted a brisk flow of traffic to and from the mainland during the past few days.

Canadian National ferries between Borden and Cape Tormentine reported heavy traffic conditions over the weekend, with

ferries leaving as many as 200 vehicles in the lineup at Borden yesterday.

Vehicles were crossing in smaller quantities, however, in the opposite direction.

Sunday, 867 vehicles crossed from Borden to Tormentine, and 759 from Tormentine to Borden.

Saturday's figures placed the Borden to Tormentine total to 867, and 1,082 vehicles travelled to the mainland on the CN run that day.

All three ferries were operating on summer schedule over the weekend.

Northumberland Ferries Ltd. reports conditions between Wood Islands and Caribou were "not too heavy... not as heavy as last year."

The MV Prince Nova, disabled earlier when she hit a submerged object while crossing the Strait, was back in action Sunday morning.

Rt. Rev. P.F. MacDonald of the Chancery Office has announced three appointments and one retirement of Roman Catholic clergy in P.E.I.

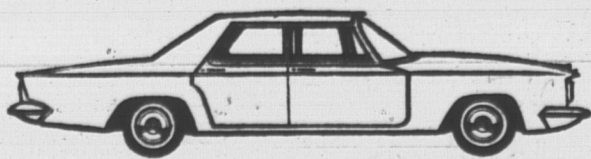
Rev. Charles Gallant, pastor at St. Charles and Little Pond, will be moved to Egmont Bay.

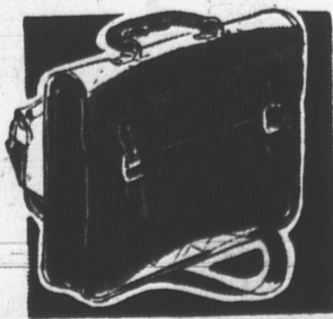

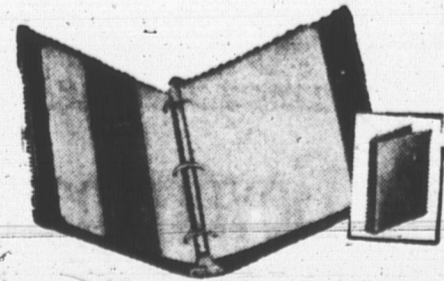
