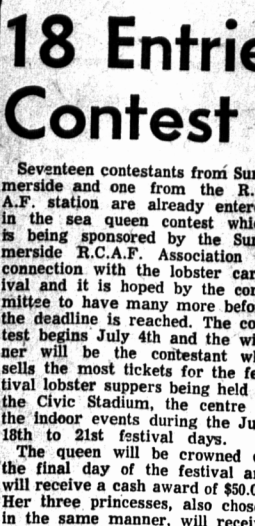


Illustration Field Day Held At Knutsford Farm On Friday

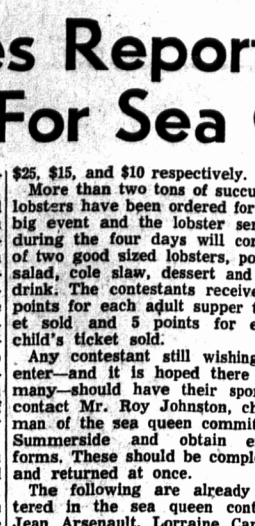

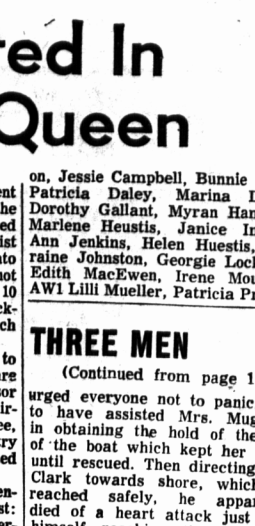

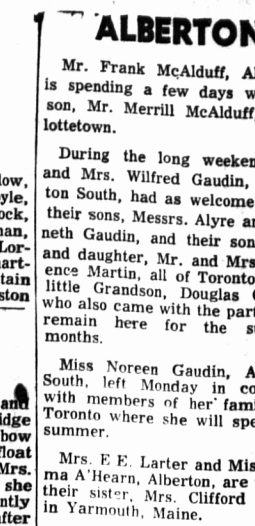
