Ontario Lacrosse Ass'n Withdraws From Playoffs

By JACK SULLIVAN Canadian Press Sports Editor The Ontario Lacrosse Association executive said in a statement this week it will not participate in the annual East-West Minto and Mann Cup championship series in 1966. Don't believe it.

The OLA, for some reason or other, decided to wash its dirty linen in public. It has been squabbling with the parent body of the game, the Canadian Lacrosse Association, and its announcement was ill-timed.

It came just hours before the 1965 best-of-seven championships started in New Westminster, B.C., and Oshawa, Ont. Jim Bishop, outspoken coach of Oshawa Green Gaels, defending Canadian junior champions who opened their Minto Cup series at home Monday night, took a rap at the officials.

ATTACKS EXECUTIVE "This is one time in the year when the news media - newspapers, radio and television guys - are more than willing to give lacrosse a good shake," he said in an interview. "And I'll tell you one thing - the production by the teams on the floor is a helluva lot better than the administration from the top. This thing won't come to pass. Ontario teams have been in the Minto Cup for the Canadian junior title and the Mann Cup for the Canadian senior championship for years and years. The basic problem is poor administration in some areas in Canada and I wish the OLA and CLA would stop squabbling. From my point of view the OLA move was announced more in frustration than anything else. Furthermore, the OLA people are making a decision now for next year's executive. How do they know the 1966 executive will go along with it? I'm convinced it won't come to pass. Ontario teams won't be around when next year's national finals are played. The lacrosse executives know as well as anyone else that if Ontario, by any stretch of the imagination, pulled out, we might as well take our lacrosse sticks and go home. Lacrosse would still operate but only at the minor level."
